Advocating for the Nome Preschool and any local nonprofits they want to support. Would like to see local organizations supported versus outside entities like the Iron Dog and Iditarod. Disheartening to see non-departmental budget zeroed out for local organizations. Thanks for considering funding for the local organizations.
