


Eagle Cliff South



To be quite honest, as a developer who was active for over 40 years, I find the Council's previous denial of this to be completely unjustified and a detriment to the development process in Norman as a whole. Denying the renewal of a preliminary plat and subsequent final plats when multiple streets are stubbed into it is unheard-of. The objection of traffic is unjustified. Traffic studies projected and specified the appropriate collector streets when the area was originally platted. Finally the objection that normal drainage, at the historical runoffs into the *river* is flooding property that was reclaimed from the river is... well ridiculous. The courts have ruled on this once. It is time Council took the responsible action and approved it.
