






Parking Business Plans

- 2013 Campus Corner Parking Management Business
 Plan (revised in 2015 and 2019)
 - Approved by Council on August 1, 2013
- 2013 Downtown Parking Lot Management Business
 Plan (revised in 2016 and 2019)
 - Approved by Council on August 1, 2013







• These business plans detail the strategies and payment options available to customers and visitors who park in the metered areas of campus corner (154 non-disabled on-street spaces and the 61 non-disabled spaces in the Asp Avenue Parking Lot) and the metered downtown Gray Street Parking Lot which has 144 spaces. These plans are designed to maximize both the level of convenience experienced by all users as well as the efficient use of public parking spaces.

- 2014 City of Norman Comprehensive Transportation
 Plan
 - Adopted by Council on May 13, 2014
- 2016 Norman Parking Study
 - Adopted by Council on August 9, 2016
- 2018 Parking Strategic Plan
 - Adopted by Council on December 11, 2018






- 2016 Norman Parking Study was commissioned to provide a blueprint for future parking improvements and expenditures.
- 2018 Parking Strategic Plan's primary goal was to be a guide for decision makers on topics such as governance, technology, enforcement, as well as planning and parking asset development and management.



Highlights from the 2018 Parking Strategic Plan


- Acknowledged the need for additional parking in the Downtown and Campus Corner areas. Proposed sites for new parking structures.
- Proposed creating a separate parking fund, governance structure, and hiring additional parking staff. Currently working with partner agencies on possible parking authority.
- Provide consistent management (meter times, meter costs, meter pay methods, enforcement) for customers and update technology.
- Integration with and consideration for a multimodal future. Increasing the walkability and bikeability in these areas as well as investment in additional mass transit.





2018 Parking Strategic Plan: Supply











- There are 8,311 total parking spaces in the Downtown and Campus Corner areas.
 - Approximately 1,313 (15.8%) are on-street.
 - Approximately 266 on-street parking spaces on Main St between University Ave and Porter Ave
 - Approximately 6,998 (84.2%) parking spaces are located in off-street parking facilities such as lots.

Campus Corner Parking Utilization (Weekday)





Private Use of Public Right of Way

- Gray Street Parking Lot, owned by city, has 41 spaces available for lease annually.
- Due to COVID, informal policy to allow 'to go order pick up' parking
- Streateries allowed by Council action and approval of license agreement
- Private use of public parking could:
 - Diminish available parking for the public
 - Cause inequity issues for the businesses
 - Create enforcement issues
