## **DETAILED JUSTIFICATION OF VARIANCE REQUEST**

#### Paragraph 1:

Special conditions exist in this instance only in that the property seeking the variance lies on a corner lot, requiring the vigilant observation of city zoning regulations mandating certain distance measurements. Other lots in the interior of this housing addition carry with them similar, but often different, measurements specific to their location.

#### Paragraph 2:

As the applicant is a builder, the lot now has a fully constructed home upon it, and the property is under contract to an innocent 3<sup>rd</sup> party. Both parties would like to fulfill the terms of the contract.

### Paragraph 3:

The error in this case was made by a separate company which prepares the drawings and site plans for the applicant. The person preparing the drawings did not correct for the building line distance and apparently incorrectly assumed that the software corrected for the distance. The issue has been corrected and should not arise again.

#### Paragraph 4:

The builder has constructed hundreds of homes in Norman as per the existing zoning requirements and seeks no special privilege and only to correct an error without causing undue hardship.
