#### TRANSPORTATION GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND

Approved by Norman voters April 2, 2019

**Bond Total:** \$72 million

**Program Total**: \$139 Million

Federal Funds Anticipated: \$67 Million (48.2%)

**Impact to Taxes:** Did not increase property taxes





#### **IMPORTANT FACTS:**


- 19 projects selected with input from City Council, citizens and the 2014 Comprehensive Transportation Plan
- Leveraged federal funds with city funds
- Includes the following types of improvements:
  - Traffic Management Center
  - Widening and reconstruction of roads
  - Installation of new traffic signals
  - Improvements to stormwater drainage systems
  - Addition of sidewalks, bike lanes and multimodal paths
- 10-year program ending in 2030

## **PROJECTS MAP**










## **CITY OF NORMAN & FEDERAL FUNDS - HISTORY**

- Fixing America's Surface
   Transportation Act (FAST)
- Over the last 28 Years:
  - \$6M / year average
  - Over 140 transportation projects
  - Total ~ \$160 Million!!





# **REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PLAN (TIP)**

- ~ \$20 Million available per year
- Competitive process (Individual projects rated and ranked)
- ACOG member agencies within the Encompass
   Planning area are eligible to apply

- No single local government can receive more than 56% of the total funding
- Beginning in 2021 (FFY 2022-2024 TIP), first two years are guaranteed. Subsequent years need to compete again.












## PROJECT SELECTION CRITERIA

#### **Eligible Projects:**

- 1. Widening, including Railroad/Highway Grade Separations
- 2. New Construction
- 3. Intersection Improvements
- 4. Resurfacing, Reconstruction, Rehabilitation, Restoration
- 5. Bridges
- 6. Independent Bicycle and Pedestrian Facilities
- 7. Transit, Park-and-Ride, High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) Lanes
- 8. Carpool/Vanpool
- 9. Safety Projects (100% Federal)





#### PROJECT SELECTION CRITERIA

#### Significant changes to the project selection criteria were made for FFY 2019

- Align with the regional Multimodal Transportation
   Plan goals and objectives
- Add transportation system performance management
- Develop a process / methodology to ensure that the region's transportation funding is being used effectively
- Adjust the scoring between types of projects to reflect the region's needs

- Improve the competitiveness of projects that utilize cost-effective congestion mitigation and safety enhancing strategies from the Congestion Management Plan toolbox
- Simplify the project application process and criteria
- Project readiness no longer a factor in the criteria
- The new criteria was finalized and accepted by both the ITTC and ITPC and was used for the first time in the formulation of the FFY 2020-2023 TIP

#### Pros:

- Gray Street begins in 2023
- Allows more time to coordinate with OU on ROW and Utilities (OU supports postponement) for the Jenkins Ave. Project
- Provides ability to obtain funding for Constitution Street
- Jenkins Ave. and Constitution St. both rank well and may compete for future federal funding

#### Cons:

- Jenkins Avenue Project delayed until 2024
- City must re-apply for federal funds for Jenkins Ave. and Constitution St.



 With the proposed federal funding, the construction years of the projects have been updated

- Should the City request the transfer of \$1,765,853 in federal funds in FFY 2023 (October 5, 2022)
  - From: Jenkins Avenue/Constitution Street projects
  - To: Gray Street 2-way project

Note: ACOG will act on this request August 26, 2021



- Looking ahead, the next projects projected to be eligible for funding are James Garner Ave. - Acres to Duffy, the resubmittal of Jenkins Ave. and Constitution St.
- Grant applications
   must be submitted by
   the City to ACOG by
   October 22, 2021
- Combined, if these projects gain federal funds, \$9M available for other projects

#### Pros:

- James Garner Ave. Acres to Duffy gains funding
- Jenkins Ave. gains funding
- Provides ability to obtain funding for Constitution Street
- Over \$9.3 million available to fund future projects (Cedar Lane Road?)

#### Cons:

- All three projects may not make the ACOG TIP
- Lowest ranking projects could reapply for federal funds in FFY 2025



# What are the BENEFITS?

- Funds have been added for other bond projects
- Additional time provided to seek funding for the remaining projects

## **COUNCIL DECISION?**

- Should the City request the federal funds in FFY 2024 (October 1, 2023) for:
  - James Garner Avenue Acres to Duffy (Phase 3) (\$2.5 million)
  - Jenkins Avenue (\$5.1 million)
  - Constitution Street (\$3.9 million)



#### **Next Steps:**

- Leverage Federal Funding (\$9.3M)
  - Switch Jenkins Ave. funding to Gray Street for FFY 2023?
  - Submit Jenkins Ave., James Garner Phase 3 and Constitution St. this fall for FFY 2024?
  - Construct Cedar Lane Road or other 2019 Bond Project in FFY 2023 w/ leveraged funding?
- Continue to pursue other grant applications on "good fit" projects
- Public engagement
