The Oklahoma Municipal League (OML) appreciates and values your continued support and participation in the League.

OML is your organization and as such we work diligently to provide members with the resources you need for your community. Below are a few examples of how OML has put revenue back into your community by our efforts at the Capitol:

- OML led the fight in getting HB 1875 signed into law which provided an additional \$310808.92 of funds to remain in your community since its passage.
- OML was the leading voice for municipalities for online sales tax reform. Reports estimate approximately **\$300 million** returning to the state.
- At the federal level, last year an amicus curiae brief was filed by the State & Local Legal
 Center on behalf of State Leagues, including OML, to enable municipalities the ability to
 collect sales tax if the retailer has no in-state physical presence to combat the loss of an
 estimated \$26 billion revenue for state and local governments.

This year OML continues to sponsor legislation to enhance municipal budgets:

- Public Safety Districts After 12 years of diligent effort, Senate Bill 838 has been approved by the Governor. Municipalities will have the ability to hold an election to appropriate up to 5 mils of an ad valorem assessment to be used for public safety expenses.
- Sale for Resale Reform House Bill 2744 provides needed updates to the sale for resale tax exemption. By reforming this law millions of dollars will be put back into municipal budgets across the state. The Bill was approved by the House and will be eligible to be heard next year in the Senate.

In addition to all the incredible work OML does at the state Capitol on your behalf, we continue to provide the most comprehensive inquiry, research and training programs built to assist your community for any need.

Together we provide a unified voice for Oklahoma municipalities. The number one ingredient for success at the legislature and state agencies is a united and collective voice.

2020 Municipal Sales Tax Rate 4% / 4.125%

Base = \$ 400

Formula = Total Sales Tax Receipts divided by Municipal Sales Tax Rate times .005 Per Capita = 2010 Census Population times .04.
