**SYNOPSIS:** The applicant, University North Park, LLC, is proposing to develop this 90 acre tract into a mixed use development with residential, hospitality, entertainment, and commercial uses. The site is planned to have a minimum of 10% open space.

**ANALYSIS:** The applicant has a master site development plan for this project which shows they plan to have internal private connections via private sidewalks and open space areas. The platting process does require the applicant to provide a sidewalk along 24<sup>th</sup> Ave NW from Corporate Centre Dr. to "Proposed Street C", which extends the length of the single-family residential portion of the development.

The existing Legacy Trail runs from Robinson to Rock Creek and goes west over I-35 at the south of this proposal.

<u>CONCLUSION:</u> Staff places this item on the consent docket for the November 21, 2023 Greenbelt Commission Meeting.
