



Dear Joshua,

Board members of Northeast Iowa Charitable Foundation wish to thank you and Mr. Mulfinger for attending our recent meeting. The presentation you gave and the handouts were very thorough in explaining the proposed trail system additions and updates.

The board members had quite a lengthy discussion, with all in agreement that your proposal is of maximum benefit to the Oelwein community as well as the outlying area residents. You gave us two options for the foundation's monetary commitment to help with funding this project. We have chosen Option B: Our foundation will make payments of \$250,000 for four years starting in 2020, and a final payment of \$175,000 in the year 2024. Our participation in this agreement is that the City of Oelwein comply with the payments on your schedule: \$250,000 in 2020, \$35,000 in 2021, and \$162,000 in 2022.

Northeast lowa Charitable Foundation is enthusiastic about this project and look forward to being a part of the process, as long as the above-stated terms are adhered to.

Thank you to you and Mr. Mulfinger for taking the time to speak at our meeting.




