Re: Unsafe Structure

After a discussion yesterday with Barb Wagner, the city will soon be faced with a large liability. 27 South Frederick is a huge building in the downtown. This two story is in terrible condition. It requires a significant cleanout, a new roof, and most likely an entire inside rebuild. Should the city continue to enforce the abatements on this building we will go down the following path.

- 1. We have already fined the owner for not cleaning out the building
- 2. Should the judge deem the issue a nuisance, the city will be responsible for cleaning out the building
  - a. We will have to hire a crew to clean it
  - b. We will invoice the building owner
  - c. Should we not get paid we will send it to taxes.
- 3. Once the building is cleaned out the roof and structural issues need to be addressed
- 4. Should the owner not address these, the courts will allow the city to correct them
  - a. At this point the city will have two choices, fix the building or tear it down
  - b. Fixing the building can be assessed to the property owner
  - c. Tear down can also be assessed to the property owner

I have laid everything out to you, because I anticipate Barb Wagner will request assistance from the city. Council will be faced with hard decisions coming forward. The problem with a successful Community Development is that sometimes you have to take on large problems. The initial bid for tear down was \$80,000.
