

## Chapter 13.08 - BUILDING NUMBERING

### Sections:

#### 13.08.010 - Definitions.

Whenever the following words or terms are used in this chapter, they shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this section, unless the context makes such meaning repugnant:

- A. "Building numbers" means the numbers placed on each main building on occupied lots. Said numbers are to be installed in a conspicuous space so as to be readable from the street or thoroughfare.
- B. "Main or principal building" means only that one building on any lot or portion thereof classed and regularly used as the main business, commercial, industrial or residence building; the term does not include sheds, untied warehouses and outbuildings.

#### 13.08.020 - City plat system to govern.

The various buildings in the city shall be numbered in accordance with the system established and shown on the city plat on file in the office of the city clerk. In those instances where one building will house two or more businesses with separate entrances, each entrance shall have a number, and, for the purpose of this chapter be deemed a principal building.

#### 13.08.030 - Size of numbers.

Numbers shall be placed on any principal buildings constructed after the time of the original numbering by the owner, and with numbers not less than two and one-half inches in height.

#### 13.08.040 - Property owner's responsibility—Placement by city.

- A. Appropriate numbers shall be placed on all principal buildings within the city, according to the plat, by the property owner of each principal building. If the property owner does not comply with the aforementioned, the city crew shall place them thereon and the cost thereof shall be billed to the owner on his personal property tax statement. After the numbers have been put on the first time, responsibility for maintaining the numbers on the buildings in question shall be the owner of said building.
- B. The superintendent of public works is authorized to put numbers on any principal buildings on which the numbers are not located or easily visible. The cost, on a time-and-material basis, of placing such numbers shall be paid by the property owner upon being billed by the city, and if not paid, shall be added to his real property tax statement.

#### 13.08.050 - Destruction of numbers prohibited.

No person shall in any way destroy or deface building numbers.
