


PINEVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT

MONTHLY REPORT June 2022

Crime Goals

Below is the evaluation of the department's crime goals. Goals are measured for 12 months based on the fiscal year. For the year of July 2021 – June 2022, the goals are to reduce violent crime by 5% and reduce property crime by 10%. By the end of the June 2022, violent crime has been reduced by 1.39% and property crime reduced by 3.28% compared to the 3-year average.






Below is a table and bar graph of the counts for Part 1 Offenses in June. For comparison, the same is shown for the past 3 years. The average of the 3 years was calculated.






Problem Locations











Problem Area


Call Count **Group A Offenses**
