The above named applicant hereby requests and authorizes Sioux Valley Southwestern Electric (SVSW) to do the above described service and agrees to pay the aid-to-construction cost listed above. Payment must be received (or arrangements made) and the following terms and conditions met before work will proceed.

THE APPLICANT AGREES TO THE FOLLOWING TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- 1. SVSW shall install, own, and maintain all facilities necessary to provide an electric distribution system. SVSW will determine the exact location of its facilities. All work will be done according to SVSW Policies, Board Operating Guides and Management Operating Procedures. If future changes to the distribution system are requested by the member that are not deemed necessary to the ongoing provision of electrical services in SVSW's sole judgment and discretion, the member is responsible for the full cost of any requested changes and any reestablishment of the system to its original configuration. SVSW will not make requested changes that in its sole judgment and discretion it deems contrary to applicable safety codes and/or sound engineering practice.
- 2. The aid-to-construction cost listed above is valid only if payment is made for the 2025 construction season.
- 3. If sidewalks or driveways on the developer's/owner's property require that directional boring and/or hand digging will be needed to install the facilities, an additional directional boring fee may be charged in addition to the aid-to-construction cost listed above.
- 4. If installation of facilities occurs between November 1 and May 1 (winter construction season), then a frost installation fee (frost charge) may be charged in addition to the aid-to-construction cost listed above. The frost charges will be billed according to the fee schedule in the SVSW policy for frost charges (2-M-102).
- 5. Prior to the installation of the above-described facilities, the developer or owner shall grant such easement rights as may be required for the installation, operation, and maintenance of said facilities, and grade levels shall be established which shall be no more than six (6) inches above or below the final finished grade. The developer or owner agrees to provide permanent access to said facilities, and does grant SVSW the right to install, operate, and maintain said facilities.
- 6. When multiple members will share a new line extension, the contribution charges shall be prorated between the members sharing the facilities. If a member(s) pays a contribution in Aid of Construction for a line greater than 1300 feet, and within 5 years additional services are constructed which utilize the portion of the line paid for, the member who paid is eligible for a refund of a portion of the original contribution. Refunds will be prorated on the basis of footage, as well as the number of members using the facility. A line section can only have one refund applied against it. The refund is limited to the original member who is taking electric service at the location. Developers are not eligible for refunds.
- 7. In the event that the member fails to use or ceases to use within the first five (5) years, the facilities as described to the Cooperative in the request for service, the member is responsible for paying for the remaining investment costs associated with installing the new facilities to the member.
- 8. Wiring certificate forms shall be posted or distributed per State instructions.
- 9. Single phase motors (10 hp and larger) and three phase motors (30 hp and larger) may require the use of soft start or other suitable starting devices that limit motor starting current. Contact SVSW for engineering review prior to the use of these motors.
- 10. Single phase services are limited to a maximum of 100 kVA of load (415 amps for 120/240 volt service).
- 11. Billing for electric energy and applicable basic charge will start when service is available or as agreed upon. A security deposit may also be required.
