Pennington Borough Council Reorganization Meeting – January 4, 2023

Mayor Davy called the Reorganization Meeting of the Borough Council to order at 7:00 pm. The meeting was held via Zoom due to the COVID19 pandemic. Borough Clerk Betty Sterling called the roll with Council Members Angarone, Chandler, Gnatt, Marciante, and Stern in attendance.

Also present were Public Works Superintendent Rick Smith, Chief Douglas Pinelli, Sergeant First Class Novin Thomas, Sergeant First Class Daryl Burroughs, Chief Financial Officer Sandra Webb, Borough Engineer Brandon Fetzer and Borough Attorney Walter Bliss.

Mayor Davy announced that notice of this meeting has been given to the Hopewell Valley News, Trenton Times and was posted on the door at Borough Hall and on the Borough web-site according to the regulations of the Open Public Meetings Act.

Open to the Public

Mayor Davy read the following statement.

Ms. Meredith Moore asked to speak on the lighting ordinance. Mayor Davy stated that will be on the agenda for the Regular Meeting and he asked that Ms. Moore hold her comments until then.

There were no further comments from the public.

Mayor Davy invited Father Ron Bacovin, Retired Paster of St. James Church to deliver the Invocation.

Mayor Davy recognized Brendan Hanson from Assemblyman Verelli's office who congratulated newly elected Council Members on behalf of Assemblyman Verelli.

Mayor Davy read the following Proclamation for Kennen Gross.

Mr. John Valenza stated that he grew up here in Pennington and has been actively involved in the soccer programs in the area. Council Members Marciante and Angarone asked the same questions related to open space and environmental issues.

Council Member Chandler made a motion to nominate John Valenza to fill the vacancy on Council, second by Council Member Gnatt. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Pennington, County of Mercer, State of New Jersey, that property taxes shall be due and payable quarterly on February 1st, May 1st, August 1st, and November 1st of each year with a ten-day grace period, after which such taxes, if remaining unpaid, shall become delinquent and interest shall be charged thereon from the date the tax was first payable to the date of actual payment, at the following rates: eight percent (8%) per annum on the first \$1,500 of the delinquency and eighteen percent (18%) per annum on any amount in excess of \$1,500.; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that payments on delinquent accounts shall be credited first to the first \$1,500 of the delinquency and then to the balance of the delinquency, and once the first \$1,500 of the delinquency has been paid, the interest rate shall be eighteen percent (18%) on the balance of the delinquency

regardless of the amount of such balance; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a year-end penalty of six percent (6%) shall be assessed on the last day of the fiscal year on the full amount of delinquent accounts with delinquencies in excess of \$10,000.; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Pennington Borough Council hereby authorizes the Tax Collector to extend the grace period for third quarter 2023 tax payments; and
