Dear Mayor Davy,

I am writing to you today to bring to the Council's attention a current practice by Hopewell Valley Bureau of Fire Safety as it pertains to applications for certification of smoke alarms, carbon monoxide alarm, and fire extinguisher compliance for the sale of private residences in the Borough of Pennington.

Although the Bureau of Fire Safety has resumed commercial and farm inspections at all properties, according to their website, "due to COVID-19 all residential inspections of one and two family dwellings at the time of resale or change of tenancy as required under N.J.A.C.5:70-4,4.19 will be done via Affidavit only. We are NOT conducting in person inspections."

Although our surrounding districts have resumed inspections for residential properties (Raritan, Manalapan, Ewing, Franklin), Hopewell Valley continues to require homeowners to self-certify, while continuing to collect the same fees from the taxpayers of Pennington Borough. What is more alarming is the fact that, "If the home has hardwired smoke alarms or a low voltage alarm system, an inspection report from a licensed electrician or alarm service company is required." They are requiring a homeowner, because they are not performing physical inspections, to HIRE A LICENSED ELECTRICIAN to certify that when the test button on the alarm is pressed, the smoke detectors all function. This local requirement, not required by the Administrative Code, places an undue burden and expense on the backs of our local taxpayers. Quite frankly, I am shocked that this practice has not been brought to your attention sooner.

There are municipalities, such as Egg Harbor Township, that require self-certification. However, there is no requirement for the homeowner to hire a licensed electrician.

Please find attached the documents referenced in this letter and I hope that the Borough Council can assist our local homeowners, seniors who are looking to downsize after paying decades of high taxes as well as many families that move WITHIN our cherished Borough, in ending this current practice.

I plan on attending the Borough Council meeting on July 5th, and can address this issue in more detail if requested.


## N.J. Admin. Code § 5:70-4.19



Current through Register Vol. 54, No. 11, June 1, 2022

Section 5:70-4.19 - Smoke alarms for one- and two-family dwellings; carbon monoxide alarms; and portable fire extinguishers

- (a) In one- and two-family or attached single family dwellings subject to the requirements of 5:70-2.3, smoke alarms shall be installed as follows:
  - 1. On each level of the premises; and
  - 2. Outside of each separate sleeping area.
- (b) The smoke alarms required in (a) above shall be located and maintained in accordance with NFPA 72.
  - 1. The alarms shall not be required to be interconnected.
- (c) Ten-year sealed battery-powered single station smoke alarms shall be installed and shall be listed in accordance with ANSI/UL 217, incorporated herein by reference. However, A/C-powered single or multiple-station smoke alarms installed as part of the original construction or rehabilitation project shall not be replaced with battery-powered smoke alarms. The effective date of this subsection shall be January 1, 2019.



- 1. Single station carbon monoxide alarms shall be installed and maintained in the immediate vicinity of the sleeping area(s).
- **2.** Carbon monoxide alarms may be battery-operated, hard-wired or of the plug-in type and shall be listed and labeled in accordance with UL-2034 and shall be installed in accordance with the requirements of this section and NFPA-720.
- (e) A portable fire extinguisher shall be installed in accordance with the following:
  - 1. The extinguisher shall be within 10 feet of the kitchen and located in the path of egress;
  - 2. The extinguisher shall be readily accessible and not obstructed from view;
  - The extinguisher shall be mounted using the manufacturer's hanging bracket so the operating instructions are clearly visible;
  - 4. The extinguisher shall be an approved listed and labeled type with a minimum rating of 2A-10B:C and no more than 10 pounds;
  - 5. The owner's manual or written operation instructions shall be provided during the inspection and left for the new occupant;
  - **6.** The extinguisher shall be serviced and tagged by a certified Division of Fire Safety contractor within the past 12 months or the seller must have a receipt for a recently purchased extinguisher; and
  - 7. The top of the extinguisher shall not be more than five feet above the floor.
  - **8.** Exception: Portable fire extinguishers shall not be required for seasonal summer units. For purposes of applying this exception, "seasonal summer unit" shall mean a dwelling unit rented for a term of not more than 125 consecutive days for residential purposes by a person having a permanent residence elsewhere, but shall not include use or rental of living quarters by migrant, temporary, or seasonal workers in connection with any work or place where work is being performed.



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

## To obtain approval, consult the chart above. This will be your guide for approval.

Applications sent via e-mail, fax, or applications without the appropriate fee we will not be processed until payment is received. Certificates are valid for 6 months or until the date of closing/change in occupancy.

If there are two separate residences on the property that are being sold or rented (i.e. a cottage or garage apartment), a separate application and fee is required for each dwelling unit.

## The follow documentation is required as to be submitted with the application and fee:

- Picture of mounted fire extinguisher and receipt for new purchase or current inspection tag
- If the home has hardwired smoke alarms or a low voltage alarm system, an inspection report from a licensed electrician or alarm service company is required.
- A picture of the mounted carbon monoxide alarm

It is recommended that the seller establish and escrow account with a minimum of \$300 in case the buyer moves in and claims something is not correct with the smoke alarms, carbon monoxide alarm or portable fire extinguisher.



Example of fire extinguisher for illustration purposes only. No specific brand is required or recommended. The extinguisher shall comply with:

N.J.A.C.5:70-4.19(e) A portable fire extinguisher shall be installed in accordance with the following:

- 1. The extinguisher shall be within 10 feet of the kitchen and located in the path of egress;
- 2. The extinguisher shall be readily accessible and not obstructed from view;
- 3. The extinguisher shall be mounted using the manufacturer's hanging bracket so the operating instructions are clearly visible;
- 4. The extinguisher shall be an approved listed and labeled type with a minimum ration of 2A-10B:C and no more than 10 pounds;
- 5. The owner's manual or written operation instructions shall be provided during the inspection and left for the new occupant;
- 6. The extinguisher shall be serviced and tagged by a certified Division of Fire Safety contractor within the past 12 months or the seller must have a receipt for a recently purchased extinguisher; and
- 7. The top of the extinguisher shall not be more than five feet above the floor.



## **RECALL 14-275**

Kidde hard-wired smoke and combination smoke/carbon monoxide (CO) alarms

#### HAZARD:

The alarms could fail to alert consumers of a fire or a CO incident following a power outage.

#### **DESCRIPTION:**

This recall involves Kidde residential smoke alarm model i12010S with manufacture dates between December 18, 2013 and May 13, 2014, combination smoke/CO alarm i12010SCO with manufacture dates between December 30, 2013 and May 13, 2014, and combination smoke/CO alarm model KN-COSM-IBA with manufacture date between October 22, 2013 and May 13, 2014. They are hard-wired into a home's electric power. The i12010S and i12010SCO come with sealed 10 year batteries inside. The KN-COSM-IBA model has a compartment on the front for installation of replaceable AA backup batteries. The alarms are white, round and measure about 5 to 6 inches in diameter. Kidde is engraved on the front of the alarm. Kidde, the model number and manufacture dates are printed on a label on the back of the alarm. "Always On" is also engraved on the front of alarms with sealed 10-year batteries.

## **RECALL 17-031**

Kidde NightHawk combination smoke/carbon monoxide (CO) alarms

### **HAZARD:**

The alarm can fail to continue to chirp when it reaches its seven-year end of life if the batteries are replaced, leading consumers to believe it is still working. This poses a risk of consumers not being alerted to a fire or CO incident in their home.

#### **DESCRIPTION:**

This recall involves Kidde NightHawk talking combo smoke/CO alarm with model number KN-COSM-IB and manufacture dates between June 1, 2004 and December 31, 2010. The alarms are hard-wired into a home's electric power. The unit has a compartment on the back for the installation of a replaceable 9V backup battery. The alarm is white, round and measures about 5 to 6 inches in diameter. "Kidde" is engraved on the front of the alarm. "Kidde," the model number and manufacture dates are printed on a label on the back on the alarm.
