2021 Long Range Planning Docket

Ordinance updates and revisions are proposed on an annual basis as an annual Long-Range Planning Docket. December of 2021 staff will provide the timely docket for the 2022 planning year. However, this year staff is providing the 2021 annual Long-Range Planning docket in this work session in effort to implement this practice of updating policy, code and regulation under the newly organized department titled Development Services.

The objective is to research, review, revise and edit the ordinances and plans for both Current and Long-Range Planning to provide the most up-to-date clear guidelines and regulations for the public. The researching and vetting process is an investment. Therefore, consideration for what ordinances and/or plans to be updated is to be evaluated with considerations with staff accessibility and time dedicated to objectives.

Staff is seeking input and direction from Council for prioritization of ordinance and plan objectives for planning year 2021 and beyond.

Sec. 215.004. TAXICABS AND LIMOUSINES. (a) To protect the public health, safety, and welfare, a municipality by ordinance:

- (1) shall license, control, and otherwise regulate each private passenger vehicle, regardless of how it is propelled, that provides passenger taxicab transportation services for compensation and is designed for carrying no more than eight passengers; and
- (2) may license, control, and otherwise regulate each private passenger vehicle, regardless of how it is propelled, that provides passenger limousine transportation services for compensation and is designed for carrying no more than 15 passengers.
- (a-1) Subsection (a) applies to a taxicab or limousine service that is operated:
 - (1) within the jurisdiction of the municipality;
 - (2) on property owned by the municipality, singly or jointly with one or more other municipalities or public agencies;
 - (3) on property in which the municipality possesses an ownership interest; or
 - (4) by transporting from the municipality, municipal property, or property in which the municipality has an interest and returning to it.
- (b) The ordinance may include:
 - (1) regulation of the entry into the business of providing passenger taxicab or limousine transportation services, including controls, limits, or other restrictions on the total number of persons providing the services;
 - (2) regulation of the rates charged for the provision of the services;
 - (3) establishment of safety and insurance requirements; and
 - (4) any other requirement adopted to ensure safe and reliable passenger transportation service.
- (c) In regulating passenger taxicab or limousine transportation services under this section, a municipality is performing a governmental function. A municipality may carry out the provisions of this section to the extent the governing body of the municipality considers it necessary or appropriate.

(d) The provisions of this section relating to the regulation of limousine transportation services apply only to a municipality with a population of more than 1.9 million

Sec. 215.073. VEHICLES FOR HIRE. The municipality may license, fix the charges or fares made by, or otherwise regulate any person who owns, operates, or controls any type of vehicle used on the public streets or alleys of the municipality for carrying passengers or freight for compensation.

The Comprehensive Plan, with the accompanying maps, plats, charts, descriptive and explanatory matter shall show the long term proposed development of said territory and may include, among other things, the proposed zoning and uses of property, general location, character and extent of streets, bridges, parks, waterways and other public ways, grounds, places and spaces, the general location and extent of public utilities, whether publicly or privately owned, for water, light, sanitation, transportation, communication, power, heat, fuel, and other purposes, also, the removal, relocation, widening, extension, narrowing, vacating, abandonment or change of use of such existing or future public ways, grounds, places, spaces, buildings, property or utilities. It may also include a zoning plan.

Sec. 11.06. - Adoption of Comprehensive Plan.

The procedure for adopting and amending the Comprehensive Plan shall be established by ordinance approved by Council.

The Council is empowered under state law, after receipt of a final report from the Planning and Zoning Commission, to regulate and restrict the height, number of stories, and size of buildings and other structures, the percentage of lot that may be occupied, the size of yards, courts, and other open spaces, the density of population, the bulk of buildings, the location and use of buildings, structures, and land for trade, industry, residence or other purposes, and in the case of designated places and areas of historical, cultural or architectural importance and significance, may regulate the construction, reconstruction, alteration or razing of buildings or other structures.

Zoning regulations shall be adopted by ordinance in accordance with a comprehensive plan, and designed to lessen congestion in the streets, secure safety from fire, panic, and other dangers, promote health and the general welfare, provide adequate light and air, prevent the overcrowding of land, avoid undue concentration of population, facilitate the adequate provision of transportation, water, sewers, schools, parks, and other public requirements, or any other purpose allowed by law.
