Agenda Item:

Consider and act upon approving the purchase of public safety communication radios and equipment for the new Central Fire Station and Emergency Operations Center, from Motorola Solutions, through a Texas Department of Information Resources (DIR) Purchasing Contract.

Description of Agenda Item:

Local governments are authorized by the Interlocal Cooperation Act, V.T.C.A. Government Code, Chapter 791, to enter into joint contracts and agreements for the performance of governmental functions and services, including administrative functions normally associated with the operation of government (such as purchasing necessary materials and equipment).

The Town of Prosper entered into an interlocal agreement with the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts Cooperative Purchasing Program (formerly, Texas Building and Procurement Commission) on March 14, 2006. Being a part of this program allows the Town to purchase emergency public safety radio communications equipment for the new Central Fire Station including the Emergency Operations Center while also meeting all competitive bid requirements.

Budget Impact:

The total amount of this purchase is \$118,196.58 and will be funded by the Public Safety Complex Phase 2 (Central Fire Station and Fire Administration) Construction Project Furniture, Fixtures, and Equipment Account 750-6610-10-00-2113-FC.
