

INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

THIS INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is entered into this _____ day of _____, 2025, by and between the City of Republic Missouri, Parks Department ("City") and Republic R-III School District ("School"). City and School are sometimes referred to herein individually as the "Party" or collectively as the "Parties."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, City is a municipal corporation and Charter City in Greene County, Missouri, and

WHEREAS, School is a Missouri School District, and

WHEREAS, School is currently the owner of real property located at 318 East Hines, adjacent to JR Martin Park, located at 400 East Hines, legally described in the Approved Final Plans labeled "Exhibit A" attached hereto and incorporated by reference into this Agreement, ("Property"), the location of planned park improvements at JR Martin Park, including a School Queuing Road Extension, and

WHEREAS, the Parties have recognized the opportunity to partner financially on a portion of the construction of a School Queuing Road Extension for the Republic School System, benefiting the City's overall transportation system, in association with other planned park improvements at JR Martin Park, and

WHEREAS, in order for City to fully develop the Property, certain public improvements need to be constructed on the Property, and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Agreement is to memorialize the Parties' agreed upon respective responsibilities for improvements on or to the Property benefiting the City's transportation system with construction of a School Queuing Road Extension, in association with planned improvements to JR Martin Park, as set forth in the Final Plans, continued maintenance of the School Queuing Road Extension through the JR Martin Park property, and to establish a Permanent Access Easement through JR Martin Park property, including the School Queuing Road Extension, to be used by the School for pickup and drop off four times daily for the School located at 318 East Hines.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, the Parties mutually agree as follows:

1. Ability to Contract: School represents and warrants that it has the ability to enter into this Agreement and to fulfill all terms contained herein.
2. Public Improvements:
 - a. Work Under This Agreement: In exchange for School's promises herein, City agrees that it shall provide for, arrange, construct, complete, plan, or coordinate the

construction of a School Queuing Road Extension, in association with planned improvements to JR Martin Park described in this Agreement (“Public Improvements”).

- b. Construction Period and Cost Estimates: The Parties agree City’s construction of the School Queuing Road Extension, in association with other planned improvements at JR Martin Park, cannot be reasonably determined until completed engineering plans are finalized, and the City has received Bids for construction of the project. The City agrees to provide complete signed and sealed engineering drawings and bid line item for the School Queuing Road Extension to School within sixty (60) days after the execution of this Agreement for School’s final consideration in Cost-Sharing the portion of the School Queuing Road Extension, extending beyond the southern boundary of the planned parking lot to Park Road. School shall then have ten (10) business days to review the completed engineering drawings and respond to City with any questions, suggestions, and/or changes or final agreement in Cost-Sharing and subsequent maintenance of the School Queuing Road Extension. Once all the questions, suggestions, and/or changes have been fully addressed and agreed upon by the Parties (“Final Plans”), a timeline as to the completion of this Agreement (“Construction Period”), along with an estimate of the construction costs for the Public Improvements (“Estimated Costs”) for the School Queuing Road Extension, shall be set by a written amendment to this Agreement signed by the Parties (“Amendment #1”). If the Amendment is not entered into by the Parties within 180 days after the execution of the Agreement, this Agreement shall terminate without liability on any Party. Any Estimated Costs provided by City to School shall not be binding on the Parties. The actual costs incurred by City, as contemplated in paragraph 3 below, shall be the amount School is required to reimburse to City under this Agreement. Nothing contained herein shall be construed to restrict City’s right to construct the Public Improvements at any time prior to the expiration of the Construction Period or to continue constructing the Public Improvements after the Construction Period, so long as City is making substantial and continuing progress toward completion of the Public Improvements. Further, the Construction Period shall be extended as necessary to accommodate delayed progress of the Public Improvements due to changes in work, any act or omissions of Developer or its employees, agents, or representatives that are contrary to this Agreement or any other cause that is not reasonably foreseen or beyond the control of City, its subcontractors, or suppliers including, but not limited to acts of God, acts of a government authority, natural or manmade disaster, delay in the transportation or shortages of materials or equipment, abnormal weather conditions or labor disputes.
- c. Road Improvements (School Queuing Road Extension): The City will contract for the construction of the School Queuing Road Extension improvements, in association with planned improvements at JR Martin Park, including the planning, scheduling, and construction according to the Approval Final Plans for the project. City has the sole discretion to determine whether such Road improvements are practical and appropriate, in light of the totality of the circumstances presented, to make such allocation of City resources. School Queuing Road Extension improvements will be located on the Property, as depicted on the Approved Final Plans. City hereby

represents and warrants that it has the power and authority to make the School Queuing Road Extension Improvements. ("School Queuing Road Extension Improvements" are included within the scope of "Public Improvements" herein).

- d. Work Performed: City will be the sole judge of the work required to fully and properly complete the Public Improvements and meet any other obligations of the City under this Agreement, including but not limited to, the work to be performed, the contractors or subcontractors hired to do the work to be performed, the engineer(s) selected, the construction methods used, equipment, materials and supplies to be used, the location and quality of the work.
- e. Site Access: At all times during the course of this Agreement, School and/or its authorized representatives shall have access to the worksite(s) and shall provide sufficient competent personnel to visit and inspect the worksite(s) and work being performed. City, its workers, subcontractors, suppliers, and representatives shall have access to the worksite(s) at all times during the course of this Agreement.

3. Costs of the Public Improvements:

- a. Engineering Plans Costs: City shall be solely responsible for all costs of the engineering plans and/or construction drawings for the School Queuing Road Extension Improvements, in association with planned improvements at JR Martin Park. Any engineering plans and/or construction drawings are subject to rejection, revision, or approval by City, in its sole discretion/opinion, as reasonably necessary to complete the Public Improvements.
- b. Public Improvements Costs: City shall be solely responsible for the direct costs of the JR Martin Public Improvements. School and City shall be equally responsible for construction costs associated with the addition of the School Queuing Road Extension, in association with planned improvements at JR Martin Park Public Improvements, as outlined below in sub-paragraph (i).
 - i. Asphalt: City will initially pay the cost of construction of the School Queuing Road Extension, including materials and labor, in association with the planned improvements at JR Martin Park. Although City will initially pay for such costs, School shall be responsible for reimbursement to City for fifty (50) percent of such costs. The Parties agree the actual costs to be reimbursed to City by School for construction shall include the actual costs incurred by City for all materials and labor used toward the construction of the School Queuing Road Extension and the actual expenses incurred by City for (1) the labor of non-City employees including contractors and subcontractors, (2) transportation, (3) taxes, (4) ensuring compliance with local, state, and federal public works laws and regulations, and (5) all other services and facilities necessary for the execution and completion of the School Queuing Road Extension.
- c. Invoicing: After materials have been purchased and/or work has commenced under this Agreement, City will invoice School on or about the fifteenth (15th) day of every month for the actual costs incurred by City for expenses allowed under this Agreement. School shall have twenty (20) days following receipt of any such invoice to obtain the

reasonable approval of such invoice from its engineer, and twenty (20) days thereafter to pay City such approved invoice. If School does not pay any invoice from City to School in accordance with the above, City has the right to stop all work under this Agreement.

- d. City Administrative Personnel: City will not invoice or attempt to collect any payment from School under this Agreement for the labor costs of City's administrative personnel which include the City Administrator, Community Development Director, Parks and Recreation Director, BUILDS Public Works and Inspector personnel, or Finance personnel. Further, City agrees not to bill School under this Agreement for labor costs of the City Attorney unless allowed under this Agreement.
 - e. Purchasing Policy: City will use the current Purchasing Policy approved by the City Council and associated Administrative Policies to facilitate requests for proposals, requests for qualifications, requests for bids, or written quotes to determine the lowest price qualified provider of materials and/or services. In so doing, City will abide by all local, state, and federal laws and regulations, including those regarding public works projects. Developer will be provided by City with all bids and/or quotes once they are opened to the public in accordance with the Sunshine Law, Chapter 610, RSMo. and other applicable law. In the event Developer determines it has a legally justifiable reason to oppose City's utilization of any responding entity, such as by objecting to competence of said entity, Developer may, within three (3) business days of receiving a copy/copies of the bid(s), provide City notice of its objection or other opposition in writing. City is not required to accept or reject any response based on the opposition of School, and will at all times comply with applicable law.
 - f. Funds Deposits: Developer agrees that any funds remitted to City under this Agreement belong to the City on receipt. Under no circumstances will any funds paid by School to the City be construed as belonging to School or being held in trust or for the benefit of School, and such payments shall be deposited and/or used for such public purposes as the City determines within its lawful discretion.
4. Tax Consequences: No warranty or representation of any kind as to the tax consequences, potential or actual, if any, is made by the Parties under this Agreement or in connection with this Agreement.
 5. Ownership in Public Improvements: School will neither have nor gain any ownership or other interest in the School Queuing Road Extension, constructed at JR Martin Park ("Property") by way of or under this Agreement.
 6. Easements: The Parties agree and intend that the City will execute an Access Easement ("Amendment #2"), with specific terms to be agreed upon by the Parties, which will provide for the School's perpetual use for queuing School drop-off and pick-up through the planned improvements at JR Martin Park's Parking Lot and the School Queuing Road Extension, located solely on property owned by the City, known as JR Martin Park; the Easement shall also address the responsibilities of both parties for the Gate between the School and JR Martin Parking Lots. The City and School will be dually responsible for the costs associated with creating the Access

Easement document, including the use of a third-party to write the Legal Description for the Access Easement. The Access Easement shall be recorded upon execution by both parties. The Parties intend that each shall be responsible for half of the recording costs. The Parties will confer to finalize recording, but either Party under this Agreement is authorized to record said Easement once executed by both Parties.

- a. Access Agreement will specify responsibilities of the School and the City in the use of the Gate to be constructed between the School Parking Lot for 318 East Hines and the planned improvements to the JR Martin Parking Lot
7. Maintenance: The City and School shall be dually responsible for maintaining and addressing the maintenance and upkeep needs of the School Queuing Road Extension, including but not limited to, routine upkeep, repairs, resurfacing, debris removal, removal of obstructions or hazards reasonable necessary to ensure the School Queuing Road Extension remains safe, accessible, and in good condition for public use, as determined by the City ("Exhibit B").
 - a. The School agrees to perform all necessary snow removal to ensure clear access to the School Queuing Road Extension, including through the planned improvements at JR Martin Park's Parking Lot, accessed from East Hines, to Park Drive, and subsequently to the School Queuing Road contained within the School property at 318 East Hines ("Exhibit C").
8. Conflict of Interest: No salaried officer or employee of the City, and no member of the City Council, shall have a financial interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement.
9. Entire Agreement: This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous written or oral agreements unless excluded herein. This Agreement may not be modified or amended other than in writing signed by the Parties.
10. Default by Developer and Termination: If, through any cause, School shall default on its obligations under this Agreement by (1) failing to timely fulfill its duties defined herein, (2) violating any of the covenants, agreements or stipulations herein, or (3) becoming insolvent, City shall deliver written notice of the default to School. If School fails to cure the default within thirty (30) days of receiving notice from City (or such longer period of time as is reasonably necessary to effect a cure, provided School initiates efforts to cure the default as soon as practicably possible and continues pursuit of the same to completion), then City shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by giving at least five (5) business days prior written notice of such termination, specifying the effective date thereof. If City elects to terminate under this provision, School shall be responsible to City for all of City's actual costs in the construction of the School Queuing Road Extension, up to and including the date of termination.
11. Default by City and Termination: If, through any cause, City shall default on its obligations under this Agreement by (1) failing to timely fulfill its duties defined herein, (2) violating any of the covenants, agreements or stipulations herein, or (3) becoming insolvent, School shall deliver written notice of the default to City. If City fails to cure the default within thirty (30) days of receiving notice from School (or such longer period of time as is reasonably necessary to effect a cure, provided City initiates efforts to cure the default as soon as practicably possible

and continues pursuit of the same to completion), then School shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by giving at least five (5) business days prior written notice of such termination, specifying the effective date thereof. If School elects to terminate under this provision, School shall be responsible to City for all of City's actual costs of construction of the School Queuing Road Extension up to and including the date of termination. Termination of this Agreement shall be the sole remedy of School for any default by City under this Agreement.

12. Jurisdiction and Venue: This Agreement shall be taken and deemed to have been fully executed and made by the parties herein and governed by the laws of the State of Missouri for all purposes and intents. Venue and forum under this Agreement or any disputes that come from it shall be in the Circuit Court of Greene County, Missouri.
13. Dispute: In the event City is the substantially prevailing party in any litigation or formal dispute resolution (i.e., binding arbitration or third-party mediation) arising out of or relating to this Agreement, City shall be entitled to recover from Developer all reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses incurred in connection with such litigation and/or dispute resolution.
14. Liability: School acknowledges and agrees that the type of work to be performed under this Agreement may cause temporary or permanent damage to the Property, and School agrees the City shall not be liable for any damages caused to the Property in the course of completing the Public Improvements. Nothing in this Agreement shall generally be construed to create or impose any liability on the part of City for any direct, special, indirect, liquidated, or consequential damages.
15. Independent Contractor: The Parties to this Agreement are entirely separate and independent from each other. This Agreement shall not be construed as creating any type of joint venture or partnership between the Parties.
16. Execution: The Parties agree that signatures transmitted by facsimile or scanned and emailed shall have the legal effect of original signatures. In addition to facsimile or scanned and email signatures, this Agreement may be executed by the Parties in accordance with the applicable version of the Uniform Electronic Transactions Act ("UETA") and the Electronic Signatures in Global and National Commerce Act ("ESIGN"). The Parties hereto agree to conduct transactions by electronic means and hereby affirmatively consent to use electronic records to memorialize and execute this Agreement and any alterations thereto. At the request of any party, the Parties shall promptly exchange executed original counterparts of this Agreement or any amendment.
17. Survival: This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties and their respective heirs, personal representatives, successors and assigns as provided in this Agreement. The Parties acknowledge and agree that the rights and benefits afforded to Developer under this Agreement shall run with the Property and shall be enforceable by and for the benefit of any and all successor owners of the Property without further consideration to or consent by the City. The Parties acknowledge and agree that at the request of any party, a memorandum of this Agreement shall be duly executed by the Parties and recorded in the

real estate records of Greene County, Missouri; provided, however, this Agreement shall be binding and enforceable as between the City and any current or future owner of the Property without recording thereof.

18. Headings: The headings in this Agreement are for convenience of reference only and shall not limit or otherwise affect the meaning thereof.
19. Whereas Clauses: The “whereas” clauses stated above are incorporated by reference as though fully set forth herein, and shall be considered material terms of this Agreement.
20. Assignment: This Agreement may not be assigned by any party without the prior written consent of all Parties.
21. Public Entity and Officer Immunity and Defenses: In no event shall the language or requirements of this Agreement constitute or be construed as a waiver or limitation of any rights or defenses with regard to applicable sovereign, governmental, official, or any individual immunities and any other protections or defenses as provided by federal and state constitutions, statutes, and laws. The procurement and maintenance of insurance shall not be construed as waiving any such defense otherwise available. If any applicable insurance is, contrary to the Parties’ intent, construed to provide coverage that would in effect waive such immunities or defenses, then such coverage is disclaimed to the extent of any waiver.
22. Severability Clause: A determination of invalidity or unconstitutionality by a court of competent jurisdiction of any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part, of this Agreement shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts to this Agreement.
23. Contingent Upon Funds and Approval: This Agreement is expressly contingent and conditioned upon (1) the allocation of sufficient funds for City to use toward its obligations under this Agreement, and (2) the approval of the City Council for the City of Republic, Missouri, by duly executed Ordinance. Developer acknowledges and agrees it has no standing or right of action against City in the event City is unable to perform its obligations under this Agreement as a result of insufficient funds or disapproval by its City Council.
24. Supplemental Agreements/Additional Action: The Parties agree to cooperate fully, to execute any supplemental agreements, and to take other additional actions reasonably necessary or appropriate to give full force and effect to the terms and intent of this Agreement.
25. Waiver: The waiver by one Party of any provision or breach of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of any other provision or breach of this Agreement.
26. Contract Documents: The Agreement shall consist of the following:
 - a. This, fully executed;
 - b. Amendment #1: Cost Estimate + Construction Period
 - c. Amendment #2: Access Easement (with Exhibit)
 - d. Exhibit A: Approved Final Plans

- e. Exhibit B: Maintenance Area Exhibit
- f. Exhibit C: Snow Removal Exhibit

27. Notices: Any notice, request or demand provided for in this Agreement shall be deemed to have been given when the same shall have been personally delivered to the following offices or when notice is received after being deposited in the United States Mail, Registered or Certified, with postage thereon prepaid as follows:


