Council Member Updike seconded. A roll call vote was taken digitally. The vote was 8 Aye-Franklin, Gerke, Gerlek, Mitchell, Pool, Self, Updike, and Wilson. 0 Nay. Motion Carried.

Motion was made by Council Member Wilson and seconded by Council Member Pool to approve Resolution 23-R-02. David Cameron provided an overview of the Resolution. The vote was 8 Aye-Franklin, Gerke, Gerlek, Mitchell, Pool, Self, Updike, and Wilson. O Nay. Motion Carried.

11.23-R-03 A Resolution of the City Council Authorizing the City Administrator to Retain an Outside Consulting Firm to Assist with the Recruitment, Selection and Post-Offer Process for an Engineer Vacancy.

Motion was made by Council Member Updike and seconded by Council Member Franklin to approve Resolution 23-R-03. David Cameron provided an overview of the Resolution. The vote was 8 Aye-Franklin, Gerke, Gerlek, Mitchell, Pool, Self, Updike, and Wilson. 0 Nay. Motion Carried.

12.23-R-04 A Resolution of the City Council Appointing Assistant BUILDS Administrator Garrett Brickner as the City's Director of the Southwest Missouri Joint Municipal Water Utility Commission And BUILDS Administrator Karen Haynes As The City's Alternate.

Motion was made by Council Member Updike and seconded by Council Member Wilson to approve Resolution 23-R-04. Garrett Brickner provided an overview of the Resolution. The vote was 8 Aye-Franklin, Gerke, Gerlek, Mitchell, Pool, Self, Updike, and Wilson. 0 Nay. Motion Carried.

Reports from Staff

City Administrator David Cameron thanked Mayor Russell, Council, and staff for attending the work session to discuss the priorities of the City. Mr. Cameron added he appreciated the feedback and looks forward to sharing that feedback. Mr. Cameron noted he will increase the information that goes out in the Administrator's Report. Our communication can improve and we are moving forward and turning inward to improve processes and glean from the feedback. Mr. Cameron added we need to understand what we can improve on. Mr. Cameron noted development isn't slowing down and we have companies from all over looking to move here, but we need to work on our processes. Mr. Cameron reported we will build on that and do a follow up work session next month.

City Administrator David Cameron announced we have posted the opening for Public Information Officer, noting Jennafer has handled it brilliantly, but we need more communication internally and externally to get our message out. Mr. Cameron noted we received 25 million dollars last June and found out we got 5 million dollars in the omnibus bill through Congressman Long. Mr. Cameron reported he met with leadership in the House of Representatives last week and discussed the meetings with the Mayor shortly after. Our request has been made again and the meetings went well with Representative Davidson, Representative Riley, Representative Deaton, and Representative Owen this week. Mr. Cameron added he will be meeting with Representative Curtis Trent soon as well. Mr. Cameron added we continue to work hard to get utility rates down and to minimize the impact to citizens, but we have to work on that plant. Mr. Cameron reported we are working with our attorneys and engineers to keep the City in compliance and the State has stepped up. We have been working on a lot of things that we just aren't communicating. Mr. Cameron noted that the Hines and Lynn roundabout is coming. Mr. Cameron shared



he is proud of the funding we have generated, which totaled 97 million dollars for the community in the last five years. It is our responsibility to find those funds but we should share the information. Mr. Cameron noted we are good at being vulnerable but not great at sharing our story.

City Administrator David Cameron thanked staff for their vision and thanked the community.

Council Member Franklin thanked staff for the workshop last week, noting he appreciated the perspective from supervisors. Mr. Franklin added it was a great session and he is looking forward to the next work session.

Mayor Russell thanked Mr. Cameron for doing the work session, noting it is easy to not do it but it takes a lot to stop and say we can do better. Mayor Russell noted the next day, he went to the animal shelter with his son, Nick, who had a project at school to pay it forward. Mayor Russell spoke to Christina Elmore, who said the workshop was the best thing she has experienced in this job. Mayor Russell noted this was a great thing.

RSMo 610.021.13 Individually identifiable personnel records, performance ratings or records pertaining to employees or applicants for employment, except that this exemption shall not apply to the names, positions, salaries and lengths of service of officers and employees of public agencies once they are employed as such, and the names of private sources donating or contributing money to the salary of a chancellor or president at all public colleges and universities in the state of Missouri and the amount of money contributed by the source

Motion was made by Council Member Franklin and seconded by Council Member Pool at 6:36 p.m. to go into Executive Session under RSMo 610.021.13 Individually identifiable personnel records, performance ratings and records pertaining to employees or applicants for employment. Closed session. Closed vote. Closed record. A roll call vote was taken. The vote was 8 Aye – Wilson, Updike, Pool, Self, Gerke, Mitchell, Gerlek, and Franklin. O Nay. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Council Member Franklin and seconded by Council Member Updike to adjourn the Executive Session Meeting at 7:12 p.m. A roll call vote was taken. The vote was 8 Aye – Mitchell, Updike, Pool, Self, Gerlek, Franklin, Wilson, and Gerke. 0 Nay. Motion carried.
