Activities/Calls

Marshal's Message

- It's time to prune your trees and bushes back to allow for safe travel along our streets and sidewalks. Intersections should be free of visual obstructions at the corners and there should be room for vehicles and pedestrians to travel safely under any branches overhanging the sidewalks and streets.
 - 5-5-200 Care And Maintenance Of Right-Of-Way Adjacent To Private Property
 - It shall be the duty of every owner or occupier of private property to care for and maintain the right(s)-of-way adjacent to their property. Care and maintenance include mowing, weed control, trees, shrubs, vines, removal of refuse and trash, and removal of hazardous conditions. For purposes of this Section, adjacent right-or-way includes the area from the adjacent street curb to the owner's or occupier's property and the area from the traveled portion of the alley to the owner's or occupier's property.
