Chief's Blotter	
<p><b>Staffing:</b> Currently we have 8 sworn officers and 2 reserve officers. Recruiting efforts are underway to fill the vacancy left by officer Taylor.</p> <p><b>COVID19:</b> Currently we have sufficient supplies. All officers are healthy, and each officer records their temperature at the shifts beginning and ending. Officers routinely disinfect vehicles and workstations. Every officer now has their own assigned portable radio to reduce sharing of equipment that is worn.</p> <p><b>Equipment:</b> The new police patrol car has arrived and is in service. The new Kawasaki Mule is also in service and the older one has been donated to Public Works for city use.</p> <p><b>Special Events:</b> RPD conducted a successful Halloween "trick or trunk" event handing out over 100 bags of individual wrapped candy and goodies. It was good to return to this limited community engagement and the event was well received.</p> <p><b>Criminal Activity:</b> An investigation of a homeless camp behind the PHBC revealed a wanted felon. A traffic stop on Bee Caves Rd led to the arrest of a subject with 2 felony warrants who was also in possession of felony drugs. An abandon stolen car with a loaded handgun was recovered in our city after it fled from another agency.</p>
