Comments: Large, majestic tree, very adpatable; provide plenty of space and deep soil; moderate growth rate; prune to shape or raise canopy if needed

## Monterrey Oak - 4





Native from Val Verde County in west Texas south through Mexico to Guatemala, Mexican White Oak is resistant to oak wilt and is a hardy evergreen oak tree spreading to 60' feet wide as it matures and a height of 80'.

# Chinquapin Oak - 5

Comments: Stately form; provide deep soil; moderate growth rate; prune to shape or raise canopy if needed

#### TX Red Bud - 3





Botanical Name: Cercis canadensis var. texensis

Plant Type: Trees (Small)/Large Shrubs

Native To: Edwards Plateau Plant Height Min: 15ft Plant Height Max: 20ft

Plant Spread Min: 10ft Plant Spread Max: 15ft

Light: Sun/Part Shade

Evergreen/Deciduous: Deciduous Seasonal Interest To: Spring

Plant Color: Pink

Water Needs: Low

Comments: Mexican variety has small wavy leaves; Texas variety has leaves that are larger and less wavy; provide well-drained site; Eastern Redbud not recommended; prune to shape, raise canopy or remove suckers

## **Mexican Plum - 1**








At maturity, a Mexican plum tree (Prunus mexicana) typically reaches a width of 15 to 25 feet.

#### Here's a more detailed look at its characteristics:





• Growth Rate: Relatively slow, around 1 foot per year

- Foliage: Deciduous, with yellow-green leaves that turn orange in the fall
- Flowers: Fragrant white or pale pink flowers in early spring
- Fruit: Edible plums that ripen in mid to late summer, changing from green to purple-red
- Hardiness: Cold and drought tolerant
- Sunlight: Prefers full sun to partial shade
- Soil: Adaptable to different soil types, but prefers slightly acidic to neutral soil
