Chief's Blotter

<u>Staffing:</u> Reserve Officer Schaffer has resigned. Officer Taylor has submitted his two weeks notice. Recruiting efforts are currently underway. Officers Wissen and Munoz completed their probationary period on September 23rd.

<u>COVID19</u>: Currently we have sufficient supplies. All officers are healthy, and each officer records their temperature at the shifts beginning and ending. Officers routinely disinfect vehicles and workstations.

<u>Equipment:</u> The new vehicle is now at CAP Fleet and currently undergoing the installation of all police equipment. Both police bicycles have been serviced and are available for patrol use.

Property room audit: Numerous items and drugs that are no longer evidentiary are being identified and an order of destruction will be sought for proper disposal. The city of Lakeway has agreed to allow RPD to place narcotics in their incinerator the next time they conduct a burn. Remaining items are being bar coded and entered the new RMS system.

<u>Special Events:</u> city officials participated in discussions with Trail of Lights organizers. This year's event should pose less traffic congestion due to the drive through only format and traffic plan designed to minimize traffic through our city.

RPD has incorporated the Hill Country Middle School located in unincorporated Travis County into our daily patrol routine to ensure a law enforcement presence for this campus.
