1. Roll Call

#### Chair Dave Bench called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

2. Discussion and possible action on the minutes from the October 22, 2024 CRCRC meeting

Brian Rider moved to approve the meeting minutes. Thom Farrell seconded the motion. The motion carried with 4 in favor and 1 abstention (van Bavel).

3. Discussion and possible action on emails and letters to the CRCRC from October 22, 2024 to November 11, 2024

4. Update and discussion regarding the November 6, 2024 Planning and Zoning meeting

Chair Dave Bench discussed the previous Planning and Zoning Commission meeting. The CRCRC discussed the proposed segmenting concept and the current building height ordinance.

Chair Dave Bench discussed the desire to hold a workshop with a consultant to review the proposed building height methods. The CRCRC discussed next steps for the workshop and accessory buildings.

5. Discussion and possible action on a recommendation for drainage, impervious cover, and floor-area ratio (FAR)

Brian Rider gave an overview of the recommendation and discussed the changes made to the report.

Members of the CRCRC asked questions regarding the recommendation.

Chair Dave Bench discussed the recommendation to form another committee to review drainage and impervious cover.

6. Discussion and possible action on a recommendation for building code enforcement

The CRCRC discussed the recommendation for code enforcement.

## Thom Farrell moved to approve the recommendations. Brian Rider seconded the motion.

The CRCRC discussed changes to the recommendations.

Brian Rider amended the motion to edit 1, add terms Mayor and City staff to review current staffing levels, edit 2, add terms enforced effectively at the end. Thom Farrell accepted the amendment. The motion carried 5 with in favor and 0 against.

Chair Dave Bench stated that the item will go to the Planning and Zoning Commission.

7. Discussion and possible action on finalizing CRCRC business

The CRCRC discussed next steps for the committee. They discussed creating a summary document and future meetings.
