 - ✓ Maintain Financial Plan with changing circumstances

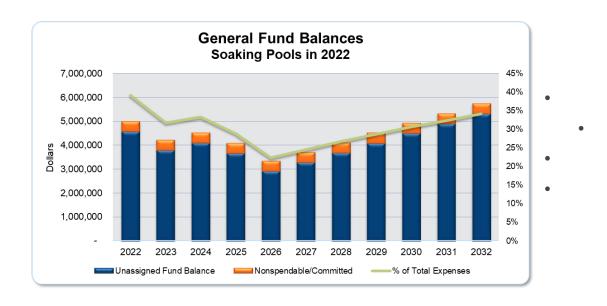


Sales Tax Growth

- Includes Sales tax receipts through July
 - ✓ Approximately 28% over budget
 - ✓ Projecting trend to continue through 2021
- 2022 projections 0% increase over 2021
- 2023 and forward show 3.00% increase in annual receipts
 - ✓ previously was using 4.00%



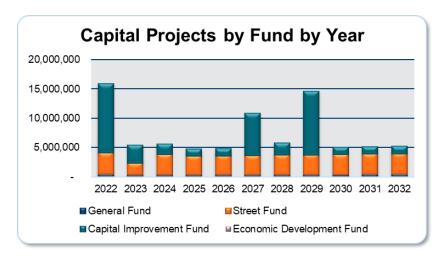

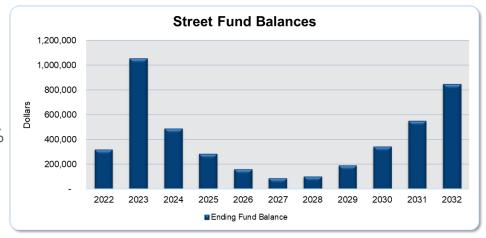

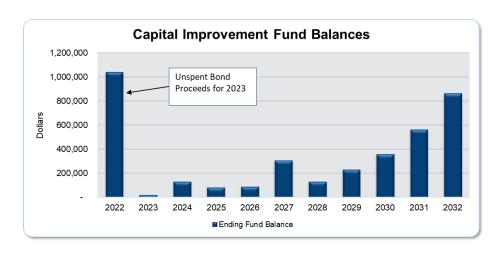
Highlights

- Assumptions:
 - ✓ Eliminated 1.5% inflation factor for 2022
 - ✓ Adjusted 2023 inflation factor to 5.0% only; 1.5% 2024 and beyond
- All projects paid for with sales taxes





Capital Improvement Fund



Highlights

- Spending outpaces current revenues
 - ✓ Bonding recommended for large projects
- \$8.5M for Fire Station included in 2022, maybe moved to 2023
- Plan still includes additional resources in 2027
- Recommended Borrowings
 - ✓ 2022, 2024, 2027 and 2029

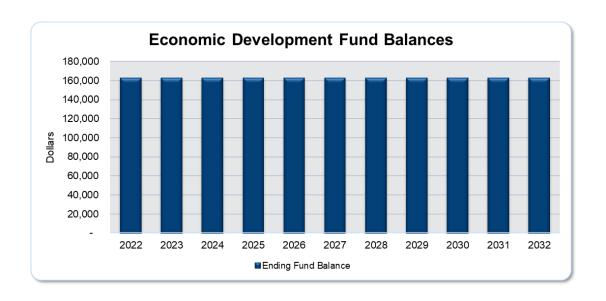
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Economic Development Fund

Future Considerations

- Generally, finances of City are in good shape
- Capital Improvement spending exceeds current resources
 - √ Grants
 - ✓ Revenue Increases
 - > 0.5% increase in taxes (approximately \$215 per Res Unit)
 - Begins in 2027
 - Transfers from General Fund phased out by 2026



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
