

JULY 2023 STAFF REPORTS

Police Department -

- We completed anther FIBARK with only minor issues. We were able to get Sarge out to say hi to people and he was a hit.
- We have been trying to do more foot patrol in the downtown area and have been meeting with business owners to see how the summer is going for them. Everyone seems to appreciate the extra effort.
- Three new employees are in training at the moment. They are about halfway through the training
 program and are all doing great. We are scheduled to have them completed and on the road by
 the end of September.
- We are less than 60 days away of finally getting our 2023 patrol cars that we ordered in October of 2023. The supply chain issues are really hurting the patrol car industry and we may have to look at other options for 2024. We have a meeting with our distributor in late July.

Finance Department –

- Department heads are busy getting their 2024 budget requests in order. Council will be provided a
 first look in mid August.
- Colorado GFOA is coming to Salida to run training programs for finance professionals. Tyler software company (a platform used by the City) will also be in Salida for training.
- Staff are starting to organize an auction of surplus inventory (i.e. heavy equipment, police cars).
- Staff continue to keep up with daily workloads and meet important deadlines.

Community Development –

- Building Permits: Things continue to be quite busy on the building permit side of things—record-setting, in fact, for the first half of the year. As of July 12th, we've seen 145 total building permits YTD, inc. 76 new residential units (includes 20 townhomes at Salida Crossings). At the same time last year, we had reviewed 104 total permits, inc. 47 new residential units. In 2021, we had reviewed 125 total permits, inc. 115 new residential units.
- South Ark Neighborhood Master Plan: The discovery of additional (likely) jurisdictional wetlands out on the site (between the river and the spring) has added a twist to the site planning—primarily in areas previously anticipated for recreational uses/fields. This has required some reconfiguring of the site and further constrains the overall buildable area. Consultants from Studio Seed continue doing a variety of infrastructure, financial, and feasibility analyses that have changed with the morphing site plan. Following a June work session with Council, Studio Seed has created a draft preferred site plan with a few alternative options that will be presented at the July 31 work session along with the latest information from those analyses. Conversations continue with potential civic

- and educational partners, especially as we gear up to pursue funding for installing future infrastructure on the site through a variety of grants that are or will be available through the state very soon.
- Land Use Code update: Staff is finishing up final review of Installment 2 of the Land Use Code update (districts, dimensional standards, and uses, etc.) and beginning review of Installment 3 (design standards). This new installment with made public for review and feedback in the next couple of months prior to a consolidated draft code being created. Conversations with the Land Use Code Advisory Committee and Planning Commission will continue through the summer. This information will also be made available on the City's Community Development webpage.
- Salida Crossings: Site work has begun, including on-site utilities, foundation prep, etc. in anticipation of building permits being issued in the coming weeks—first for the 20 townhomes and then for the first mixed-use building. The developers are still awaiting CDOT approval for work in the right-of-way (CDOT is very behind on issuing approvals), but that work is anticipated later this summer, as well. Activity on the site should increase over the coming months.

Arts and Culture –

- The exhibit from a collection of artists in celebration of Art Walk debuted in the Paquette Gallery and was recognized at the artist reception held during the monthly Creative Mixer, which was attended by (50) people.
- The first three Creativity Camps (six total are offered this summer) took place in the Annex, Ballroom, Plaza and Sculpture Garden. All camp sessions are full with up to (40) campers participating each week. All camp sessions are lead by local teachers and features local artists and creatives.
- The Community Read program, which was a partnership with Salida Regional Library, culminated in an evening talk with author Peter Heller (The Dog Stars) in-person at the SteamPlant Theater. The event was attended by (90) people.
- The Arts & Culture department programmed and partnered on several events during Art Walk weekend (June 23-25) that celebrated the 30th Anniversary of the event. Highlights included 1) five performances by the 101st Army Band throughout the Creative District; 2) Mini Masterpiece Preview and Auction; 3) History of Salida Artist Exhibition; 4) Art on Film screening of documentary on artist Mary Cassatt.
- The Summer Concert Series in Riverside Park kicked off on June 29 with local favorite Mo'champipple taking to the stage. The free concert was attended by more than (200) people. Seven more concert dates are slated for the summer.

- Spring runoff triggered several incidents on the river during June.
- We are currently at 587 Incident responses for the year with 116 incidents in June.
- We took delivery of my new Chief's Vehicle on June 12th. Defender supply did an outstanding job building the vehicle and the project came in under budget.
- Drew, Christy, Kathy Rohrich, Neenan and I presented our EIAF Grant request to DOLA on June 28th in Denver. We are hoping to hear very soon if we are successful in being awarded money for the new firehouse.
