Subject:	PUBLIC HEARING: Resolution 2025-39 - Extension of Existing Moratorium on Development

DECISION TO BE MADE:

Whether to approve Resolution 2025-39, which would extend the duration of the development moratorium while the City continues to work to address its wastewater system challenges.

APPLICABLE COUNCIL GOAL:

- **Goal 7.6:** Continue to comply with the terms of the consent decree.

BACKGROUND / CONTEXT:

The City Council previously enacted a development moratorium (Moratorium 4.0) on June 2, 2025, as a result of the ongoing capacity issues the City is experiencing with its wastewater treatment system. That moratorium is scheduled to expire on December 2, 2025.

The Consent Decree requires the City to take whatever actions are necessary, including enactment of a development moratorium, to limit new connections to the City's sanitary sewer system, and modifications to existing connections to the City's sanitary sewer system that increase flows, in accordance with the capacity cap established pursuant to the Consent Decree.

The City continues to make great progress toward both (1) acquiring increases to the capacity cap under the Consent Decree in the near term, and (2) studying and working toward a long-term solution to eliminate the capacity cap entirely. At this time, however, the capacity cap that was in effect when the current moratorium was adopted remains in effect.

KEY CONSIDERATIONS / ANALYSIS:

In order to ensure continued compliance with the Consent Decree, it is necessary to extend the current development moratorium while the City's work to address wastewater system capacity issues is ongoing.

BUDGET IMPACT:

No direct budget impacts are anticipated.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends adoption of Resolution 2025-39.
