Board Orientation

Purpose of the Board

- Advise City Council and staff on parks, trails, facilities, recreation, senior services and open spaces
- Represent community perspectives and user groups
- Support long-term planning and stewardship of public assets

Role of Board Members

- Serve in an advisory (not decision-making) capacity
- Review plans, policies, and projects and provide recommendations
- Balance personal viewpoints with the broader community interest
- Act as ambassadors for the parks and trails system

Previous years accomplishments

- Cedar park opened November 2, 2024 and saw 108,000 visitors in the first year
- Cedar Park was awarded the Oregon Recreation and Parks Association (ORPA) Design and Construction Award and the DJC Top Projects award
- Roughly 39,000 visits to Meining Park during Winterfest 2025
 - Raised \$24,000 for Winterfest 2025 (Biggest year yet!)
 - Gave vendors the chance to participate in Winterfest. We had over 20 vendors sign up.
- Raised \$87,175 in sponsorships for fiscal year 24/25
- Received \$791,146 in grant funding from Travel Oregon and the OPRD Local Government Grant Awards for Meining renovations
- Raised \$73,200 for our Nutrition Program While Serving nearly 12,000 meals to homebound seniors in the greater Sandy Area
- Re opened in-person congregate meals, Served 450 meals since opening in July
- Received a Grant for \$68,000 for the installation of a live streaming Camera at Jonsrud Viewpoint.
- Mt. Storm Youth Basketball-Served Nearly 300 families from Grades 1-6 in our youth basketball recreation program
- Adult Softball-12 teams & over 120 players participating
- Recruited for and hired a Facilities maintenance staff member
- Constructed Deer Pointe park 3 acres paid for by parks SDC

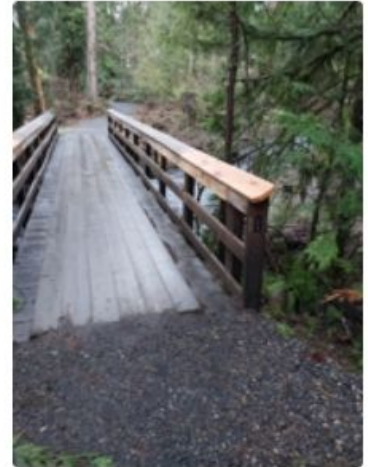

- City-maintained parkland and open space total around 282.6+ acres of parkland, trails, and open space — with 40.25 acres in actively developed parks and the rest as natural/open space.



Facilities Maintenance

New role started 9/24/25- 1 Full Time staff member

- Improved facility maintenance response time, decreasing the average work order completion time from 419 hours (December 2024) to 76 hours (December 2025).
