The Process...Where we were to where we are

Policy:

- March 20,2023, City Council adopted our policy for naming or changing names of our parks, trails or recreational facilities.
- Just so happens that we are building a new park...
- Per the policy, a committee is needed to help organize the work of naming a new park:

 - Chair-John Hamblin
 - Co-Chair-Will Toogood

The Process...Continued

Committee

- August 31, 2023, The committee had their first meeting.
 - Policy and Process were introduced
 - Chair and Co-Chair were named
 - Parameters for naming were created and agreed upon
- Chair & Co-Chair
 - Met separately to finalize initial public survey
 - Designed for public to suggest names
 - On September 14, 2023, the survey went live

The Process...Continued

Survey 1

- People suggested their own names based on the parameters
- 144 unique entries
 - Most followed the parameters
 - Some people took creative liberties
- Chair and Co-Chair vetted entries
 - 10 names were suggested multiple times

The Process...Continued

Top 10

Park Name	Description Notes	Score
Cedar Ridge Park	Location (near the Old Cedar Ridge School), Named Cedar Ridge for the Ridge it is on and the trees surrounding it.	
Pioneer Park	Recognizes the pioneers that made their way to Sandy during the westward expansion, our proximity to the end of the Oregon Trail & The "spirit" of a pioneer..."trying something new".	
Olin Y Bignall	With the loss of the pool, we can continue to honor a man who gave to our Community. The Olin Y Bignall Aquatic Center is adjacent to the new park.	
Cedar Park	The surrounding nature consisting of Cedar Trees and the neighboring Cedar Creek.	
Gateway Park	Sandy is considered the "Gateway" to Mt. Hood.	
Cedar Creek	Referencing the neighboring Cedar Creek.	

The Process...Continued

Survey 2

- On November 3, 2023 The final survey went out with the Public & Committees top choices.
 - Discovery Park
 - Cedar Park
 - Sandy River Park
- The survey closed on November 27, 2023.

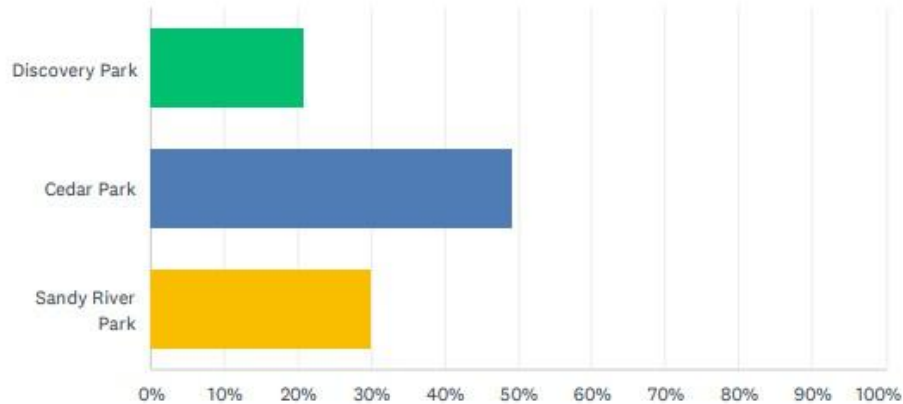


The Process...Continued

Results

Sandy River Park	29.81% 172

To Summarize...

The Chair and Co-Chair made policy and data driven decisions throughout the process.

1. Entries were vetted based on the parameters of our Park Naming Policy.
2. Suggestions with multiple entries were compiled and blindly ranked by the Park Naming Committee.
3. The top 3 suggestions were presented to the public in our final survey.
4. Cedar Park was the clear winner with 284 votes. Second place received 172 while third received 121.
5. On December 6, 2023, the Parks Trails and Advisory Board recommended that the proposed name “Cedar Park” go before City Council for adoption as the name for Sandy’s newest park.



Next Steps...

RECOMMENDATION:

Based on the use of the Park Naming Policy, public engagement and data driven decision making, The Chair and Co-Chair of the Park Naming Committee and The Parks and Trails Advisory Board recommend Cedar Park, to City Council, as the name of Sandy's newest park.
