RESOLUTION NO. 2023-03

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANGER, TEXAS, ADOPTING DENTON COUNTY'S HAZARD MITIGATION ACTION PLAN 2023; AUTHORIZING ITS EXECUTION, AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Sanger recognizes the threat that natural hazards pose to people and property within Denton County; and;

WHEREAS, the the Federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 and Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) require communities to adopt a hazard mitigation action plan to be eligible for the full range of pre-disaster and post-disaster federal funding for mitigation purposes; and:

WHEREAS, the City of Sanger has assessed the community's potential risks and hazards and is committed to planning for a sustainable community and reducing the long-term consequences of natural and man-caused hazards; and

WHEREAS, the Denton County Hazard Mitigation Plan outlines a mitigation vision, goals and objectives; assesses risk from a range of hazards; and identifies risk reduction strategies and actions for hazards that threaten the community; and

WHEREAS, adoption by City of Sanger demonstrates its commitment to the hazard mitigation and achieving the goals outlined in the Denton County Hazard Mitigation Action Plan 2023; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the passage of this Resolution is in the best interest of the citizens of Sanger.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANGER, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. The facts and recitals set forth in the preamble of this resolution are hereby found to be true and correct.

SECTION 2. That the City Council of Sanger, Texas, adopts the 2023 Denton County Hazard Mitigation Plan.

a. The City of Sanger will pursue available funding opportunities for the implementation of the proposals designated therein and will, upon receipt of such funding or other necessary resources, seek to implement the actions contained in the mitigation strategies; and

- b. The City of Sanger vests with the Mayor the responsibility, authority, and means to inform all parties of this action; assure that the Hazard Mitigation Plan will be reviewed at least annually and that any needed adjustments will be presented to the City Council for consideration; and
- c. The City of Sanger is to take such other action as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the Plan and report on progress as required by FEMA and the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM).

SECTION 3. That this resolution shall become effective from and after its date of passage.
