The Navajo Heritage & Historic Preservation Department (NNHHPD) has reviewed the proposed rehabilitation plan for the historic Oljato Trading Post. NNHHPD is in full support of this undertaking to stabilize, rehabilitate, and reestablish the historic Oljato Trading Post. The trading post is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and places such as this are significant properties and are important places in Navajo history.

As the Navajo Nation's Tribal Historic Preservation Office (THPO), we are responsible for carrying out substantial components of the National Historic Preservation Act, which provides the tools needed to revitalize, rehabilitate, and protect the places that give meaning not only to the Oljato community but to the Navajo Nation as a whole.

We are requesting that all documents such as written assessments, project plans, etc., be provided to our office for review and comment. All planned construction and rehabilitation activities will ensure compliance with the Secretary of Interior's Standards for Historic Properties. We also ask that a maintenance plan document is created that outlines proper maintenance techniques for preserving the building for the future.

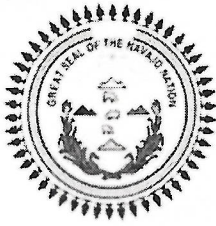

OLJATO CHAPTER RESOLUTION

Resolution#: OLJ 06-16-2019

OLJATO CHAPTER HEREBY SUPPORTS AND APPROVES FOR COOPERATING ENTITIES AND NOT LIMITED TO SAN JUAN COUNTY, SAN JUAN COUNTY HISTORICAL COMMISSION, UTAH DIVISION OF STATE HISTORY, STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICE (SHPO), UTAH DIVISION OF INDIAN AFFAIRS, AND NAVAJO NATION HISTORIC DEPARTMENT, TO STABILIZE AND REHABILITATE THE OLJATO TRADING POST.

WHEREAS:

1. Pursuant to 26 N.T.C., Section 1, (B), (1), (2) and Section 103, (B), the Oljato Chapter is recognized as a local government entity and delegated authorities and responsibilities with respect to local matters consistent with Navajo Nation Laws; and
2. Pursuant to 2 N.T.C., Section 4028 (a), the Oljato Chapter has the authority to review matters affecting the community and make appropriate recommendations to the Navajo Nation, County and State government agencies, and other governmental entities, and
3. The Oljato Chapter acknowledges the Oljato Trading Post as a historic site; and
4. Oljato Chapter supports efforts to stabilize and rehabilitate the deteriorated, dilapidated and unstable historic structures; and
5. The State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) Certified Local Government (CLG) program can provide a matching grant of up to \$10,000 in the next grant round in January 2020. San Juan County is eligible to apply for CLG grants because of its partnership with SHPO; and
6. The cooperating parties will continue to explore and identify other sources of funds and expect the 2020 CLG grant will provide funding sources to this project; and
7. San Juan County can apply for the 2022 CLG grant (a CLG can apply only every other year); and
8. The SHPO will provide with permission from the Navajo Nation to visit the site and conduct a structural assessment. Written assessment will be shared with all parties. All recommended rehab work will meet the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation in order to ensure financial support from federal and other funding sources; and
9. After reviewing the assessment, the cooperating entities will discuss opportunities for proceeding with the Oljato Trading Post project and will identify the "lead" parties both for specific action items as well as for the overall project.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

Oljato Chapter supports and approves for the cooperating and not limited to the Navajo Nation, County, State, National, and Federal entities to stabilize and rehabilitate the Oljato Trading Post and Hogan.
