

Which sporting groups do you identify with? (choose all that apply)

I would like to see a similar setup to the MAC floor at the University of Idaho which allows for all sports to be played on the same surface.


Stay the course with the new manager Ryan and evaluate every 6 months

Tournaments to add more revenue

Give Ryan a chance

The James E Russell center was donated as a gift in memoriam for the court sports tennis and pickleball. All sports need indoor winter amenities, regardless of which is chosen one will felt left out.

The funds for JER, the facility itself was earmarked for tennis and pickleball. As the gift recipient, the city of Sandpoint SHOULD have either accepted the gift knowing it would run a deficit.

The current fee structure is not working. The membership retention is low because members do not see value for the money spent. Members should get priority reservations and not pay additional fees.

With the new Rec Manager let's give it 6 months and focus on programming

1. Shouldn't the intent of the Russell family gift be honored?
2. It is very shortsighted to change course only 6 months into the management of the facility.

Our beautiful gifted facility has only been open 6 months and you want it changed. USTA has stated 3 years to see great change and you want to do it now. Going against the wishes of the Russell famil

Implement a structured volunteer network to run events. For example, I lead a large religious org that could provide many youth and adults who are already involved in the community who could help.

Give the new rec facilities manager a chance to implement a plan. We haven't given this facility a true opportunity to shine.

Put the time and resources to expand clinics and use of the facility. lowering the cost or changing the fee structure to be more desirable for seniors and families. The cost has been prohibitive

Cast a wider net to keep this facility more inclusive to all user groups.

Programming, programming, programming!!

We should invest in the community for which the building was designed.
Changing course is not a good answer. Build the current program for the future.

Opening up this facility to be more things to more people will cement its status as a true community resource. Kudos to staff for recognizing this opportunity and engaging the public on this decision.

Fully automate access control, lights, and HVAC,, utilizing facial recognition CAMERAS.... Any floors turf etc should roll up towards the ceilings but still look good.. Must be easy!!!

LPOSD is considering how much we can offer financially to support more sports at the JER building including tennis. That number will be determined as we understand what our multisport options are.

The Russell family donated the money to be used as a tennis and pickleball facility only. The city could have declined the gift knowing it was too much of a financial responsibility for the city to be





Think about the unused time of this facility when the "future" user groups are in school.

Seems like these youth groups would all be vying for the same time and leaving the daytime open.

Programming programming programming

Consider the original gift from the Russell family for a racquet center. In under four months you mismanaged JER with no programming to grow the sports. All these user groups will covet the same time.

There are only 100 current members. Annual members are unlikely to renew based on current membership retention rates. The loss of lifeguards at city beach is unacceptable to me

3. You need the give the facility at least a year before making changes. 4. The current fees are very & almost too reasonable. Charge the racket sports the same amount of daily fees.

The city should prioritize brining back lifeguards at city beach over this facility.

See the previous response... ask that the city council do its due diligence in supporting modifications within the current tennis/pickleball use to increase revenue

The donation was specifically made for "racket" sports. Have you explored the options of the senior citizens regarding Silver Sneakers and similar programs.



Youth sports creates safer communities adult sports creates healthy seniors...

It is early in the process memberships will go up in the next year. If you make it a multi sport complex you will start loseing tennis and pickleball memberships. Bring in programs tournaments to help

Concentrated professional local marketing., thru media and advertised programs.
Charge a flat monthly fee and a reduced fee for all youth.

We have a large youth pop. of this community that plays baseball and softball and have extremely limited space for them. We have 2 batting cages to serve almost 400 kids, and 0 space during winter.

This was given to the city for raquet sports. Give your new management hire time to see if revenue and player retention can help.

Jeremy Grimm should resign or be recalled over the removal of the lifeguards from city beach

As a Sandpoint native of 40+ years, a multi sport facility for youth athletics is long overdue. This is a good opportunity to support all sports in a shared facility.

I think that you are moving to fast to change the facility when it only has been open for 6 months lot of repairs to courts by making multiple use. You didn't change other areas this quick.



Jason Welker has shown that he is incompetent of managing this facility.

Would multiple users pay as high a fee as tennis and pb players.

Remember the reason for the gift. Think long term. Tournaments etc. what about facilitators. Volunteers. It worked at the fairgrounds Survey results presented by Mr Walker were dramatically biased in that less than 10% of those surveyed were part of pickleball and tennis community. The USTA is the best option

We need more space for our youth to play during the winter, especially for baseball and softball. It be great if it's more inclusive of the whole community, especially the kids.

5. Offer court sponsorships to the business community per month or year, per court. A simple way to increase revenues. 6. Remember adding sports will drive away current sports - not a good trade

The donations entire purpose was to support the tennis community. I think to turn it into something it was not intended for is not right. Adding more sports will change the environment.

The JER space was intended to be a multi sport facility, as expressed from the original donor. Opening it to the multii sport community would guarantee much more use of the facility/increase funding.



The USTA will provide the best option both for facility management as well as increasing community participation.

I wish there were different use costs depending on if you are a city resident. As a city resident I am paying for this facility with my tax dollars. County residents are not.

7. Do you really want to spend more money to set up sports that will request the same blocks of time, leading to a loss of revenues.

The JER has offered nothing other than a space to play. Before you vary from the original intent of the Russell family it seems fair to offer a better experience. Perhaps unburden the JER of Welke

Give it another six months before making judgements. Center has not been promoted very well. Ask for volunteers to help. Give it time. Five months is not enough time to change the usage especially when no programs have been offered to grow the sports it was designed for. Let the USTA make the effort for a few years.

8. Have you considered going to the racket sport community and ask for volunteers in two hour blocks to man the desk, clean the facility etc?

Give it more time! Give your new rec person the opportunity to market it and make it better. You are caving to pressure.

The percentage of Bonner County's youth that play racquet sports is a small percentage compared to the percentage that play "multi sports." A multi sport facility is an investment in our future.

I believe the turf user groups will only really want to utilize indoor space when the outdoor fields close. So you're looking at Nov-Mar. If usage drops or memberships in those months, it would help Specializing into single sports in a space that big seems very difficult.
