



Proclamation

WHEREAS, in 1962, President John F. Kennedy proclaimed May 15th National Police Officers Memorial Day, and the calendar week in which it falls as National Police Week to honor the service and sacrifice of officers killed in the line of duty; and

WHEREAS, there are approximately 800,000 sworn law enforcement officers serving in communities across the United States, including dedicated members of the City of Snoqualmie Police Department; and

WHEREAS, since 1786, more than 25,000 law enforcement officers have been killed in the line of duty; and

WHEREAS, the names of these dedicated public servants are engraved on the walls of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington DC; and

WHEREAS, we recognize that every day, police officers risk their lives in service and protection of others;

WHEREAS, in honor of fallen officers and their families, U.S. flags should be flown at half-staff; and

NOW, THEREFORE I, James Mayhew, Mayor of City of Snoqualmie do hereby proclaim May 10th, 2026 – May 16th, 2026, as:

NATIONAL POLICE WEEK

in the City of Snoqualmie and publicly acknowledge the brave service of law enforcement officers in the City of Snoqualmie and in communities across the nation.
