City Council Roundtable Meeting

CALL TO ORDER & ROLL CALL: Mayor Mayhew called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm.

Motion: Councilmember Holloway made a motion to excuse Councilmember Washington. Seconded by Johnson.

Motion passed: 5-0.

Motion: Councilmember Holloway made a motion to approve the agenda as prepared. Seconded by Councilmember Murphy.

Motion passed: 5-0.

1. SPECIAL BUSINESS.

Mayor Mayhew announced that the Council would be entering into an executive Session pursuant to RCW 42.30.110 (1)(i) To discuss with legal counsel representing the agency matters relating to agency enforcement actions, or to discuss with legal counsel representing the agency litigation or potential litigation to which the agency, the governing body, or a member acting in an official capacity is, or is likely to become, a party, when public knowledge regarding the discussion is likely to result in an adverse legal or financial consequence to the agency.
