### Summary

#### Introduction\*

The King County Jail has provided the 2026 detention rates, effective January 1, 2026, for booking and housing for arrestees pursuant to the Interlocal agreement between the City of Snoqualmie and King County effective January 1, 2025.

#### **Proposed Motion**

#### Background/Overview\*

What was done (legislative history, previous actions, ability to hyperlink)

The City of Snoqualmie and the Snoqualmie Police Department (SPD) have an Interlocal Agreement for Jail Services. Per the agreement, King County Jail has provided 2026 detention rates. The fee increases for 2026 are in line with Exhibit III, section 5 of the Interlocal Agreement for Jail Services with King County. Attached are the new King County 2026 detention rates, along with a copy of the Interlocal Agreement, highlighting the 2026 fee increases are authorized per the agreement.

### Analysis\*

The King County 2026 detention fee rates, effective January 1, 2026, are consistent with the current Interlocal Agreement between King County and the City of Snoqualmie for jail services.

#### **Budgetary Status\***

Funds have already been authorized in this year's budget.

#### **Budget Summary**

The City uses King County as a "last resort" booking facility, as it requires higher fees than other jail service providers in the region. The increase to King County jail services, which averages 5% across all fees and charges, was enacted in accordance with the 2025 ILA and was budgeted for within the 2025-26 Biennial Budget. However, as the City has made use of other jail service providers in the region, the amount spent for King County Jail Services has dwindled. Currently, nothing has been spent on this ILA in 2025, and \$4,740 was spent during 2024. As such, the fee increase is expected to have a very minimal effect on the budget.
