The City of Snoqualmie's priorities are guided by the City Strategic Plan which was adopted by Council on November 10, 2025. Three Strategic Initiatives will focus the City's efforts from 2026 to 2030:

- I. **Invest in a trusted community relationship.**
- II. **Provide responsive and fiscally responsible City services.**
- III. **Proactively increase housing options and economic vitality.**

Our Commitment and Focus for this year

In 2026, the first year of Strategic Plan implementation, the City is focused on the following items.

Investing in a trusted community relationship.

As part of our commitment to exploring pressures and tradeoffs in two-way engagement with community members, we will:

- Identify where we have gaps in communicating to or engaging with specific community groups or populations.
- Explore opportunities to partner with organizations and community leaders who can help bridge those gaps.
- Continue to have a City presence at community events.
- Explore options for City Council Members and City staff to engage community members in informal settings outside of City Hall





Providing responsive and fiscally responsible City services.

To continue to make the most efficient use of City resources, we will:

- Inventory City services and establish performance levels and metrics for each service.
- Assess the overall condition of our capital assets and establish performance levels and metrics for each capital program.
- Develop a standard operating procedure for the collection of revenues, with clear roles and responsibilities.

In pursuit of mutually beneficial regional partnerships, we will:

- Seek to establish recurring staff-to-staff and/or council-to-council meetings with the Snoqualmie Tribe, Snoqualmie Valley School District, and City of North Bend.
- Evaluate whether a regional partnership could be a viable alternative to expanding the Snoqualmie Community Center.

Proactively increase housing options and economic vitality.

We will support infill development, redevelopment, and diversifying housing options by:

- Updating key aspects of our zoning and land use tools.
- Evaluating strategies to support housing development at a range of price points.
- Supporting tourism and new development in Downtown Snoqualmie.
