



PARKS & PUBLIC WORKS DEPT.

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Monthly Report – August 2026

Road Maintenance and Repair: Summer paving activities have been completed.

Reclaimed Irrigation Reservoir: The project is substantially completed with landscaping work to be finalized over Fall of 2026. The new reservoir pump station is fully operational, and the old pump station is planned for decommission after the Summer irrigation season.

River Trail: The project has been substantially completed and is open to the public for use. A grand opening and ceremony are planned for August 2026. Minor changes and continued landscaping will continue in the Fall when the temporary irrigation is removed.

Sandy Cove Bank Stabilization: The contractor for the bank stabilization project began the construction work in late July. Site controls, initial survey work, clearing of vegetation and site preparation were the primary work activities of July. August includes the beginning of the bank stabilization work including the larger in-water stabilization spurs and includes upstream bank roughening. The project completion is anticipated for November 2026.

Urban Forestry/Street Tree Replacement Program: The City held a neighborhood meeting at Hoff Park to kick-off the upcoming street tree improvements along Thompson Avenue. The contractor has begun installing new topsoil and undrains to the landscape strip along the west side of Thompson Avenue. Project completion is expected Fall 2026.

Wastewater Division: Crews have begun the Reclaimed Water Irrigation season. Performance testing has been successfully completed, and the system is fully operational as the team works through commissioning of equipment. Maintaining reclaimed water operations.

Water Division: Irrigation season is fully underway, including commissioning of the new controls system. Additional preparations are ongoing with the North and South wellfields in anticipation of summer irrigation season.

Parks and Streets Division: Cottonwood and Hoff parks were completed as part of this year's Playground Replacement Program. Parks crews are keeping up with maintaining of streetscape (including seasonal flower baskets), fields, and playgrounds for the higher usage caused by Summer school vacations, field reservations, and tournaments. In addition, new signage was placed on 384th Ave SE to improve speed sign visibility.

Urban Forestry and Stormwater Division: Crews are also continuing inspections and maintenance activities on stormwater infrastructure, including catch basins, water quality treatment facilities and ponds. Urban Forestry is also maintaining a busy events schedule with the Green Snoqualmie Partnership, hosting volunteer work parties on a routine schedule. Seven Green Snoqualmie events were held in July. Nine events are currently planned for August.
