



PARKS & PUBLIC WORKS DEPT.

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Monthly Report – July 2026

Road Maintenance and Repair: Public Works is currently performing alley maintenance, pothole repairs, and street sign cleaning. Summer paving activities have been completed, and additional tasks such as striping, reflector installation, and crosswalk painting are ongoing.

Reclaimed Irrigation Reservoir: Upgrades to the City's reclaimed water system have been completed on-schedule and within budget. The reservoir, pump station, and control systems configuration are currently undergoing commissioning and performance testing. A notice of substantial completion has been submitted to the Dept of Ecology with their concurrence.

River Trail: The project is nearly completed. Work activities are currently focused on completion of the finish planting.

Sandy Cove Bank Stabilization: The contractor has begun preparations for work at the Site. Equipment, materials, and much construction fencing will begin to appear onsite in the next week in anticipation of the in-water work window starting mid-July. Project completion is anticipated for November 2026.

Wastewater Division: Crews have begun the Reclaimed Water Irrigation season. Performance testing has been successfully completed and the system is fully operational as the team works through commissioning of equipment.

Water Division: Irrigation season is fully underway, including commissioning of the new controls system. Additional preparations are ongoing with the North and South wellfields in anticipation of summer irrigation season.

Parks and Streets Division: The Splashpad grand opening was held with much fanfare on June 16th. Event season is fully underway with "Red White and Boom" and "Thomas the Train" events leading things off. Streets maintenance includes alleyways, pothole repairs, sign cleaning, and street sweeping.

Urban Forestry and Stormwater Division: Forestry crews have been focused on the Thompson Ave Street Tree Replacement project, which will begin construction mid-July. Crews are also keeping up inspections and maintenance activities on stormwater infrastructure, including catch basins, water quality treatment facilities and ponds. Urban Forestry is also maintaining a busy

events schedule with the Green Snoqualmie Partnership, hosting volunteer work parties on a routine schedule. Keep an eye out for pending events coming soon.
