SUMMARY

INTRODUCTION

The City of Snoqualmie requires a regular levy in the amount of \$8,625,781 which includes an increase in property tax revenue from the previous year, and amounts resulting from the addition of new construction and improvements to property and any increase in the value of state-assessed property, and amounts authorized by law as a result of any annexations that have occurred and refunds made, in order to discharge the expected expenses and obligations of the City of Snoqualmie.

BUDGET IMPACTS

The property tax is a significant source of revenue for the General Fund (#001) and has been incorporated into the proposed 2023-2024 Biennial Budget. Please see the exhibit entitled "2023 Property Tax Council Report" for more information.

PROPOSED ACTION

Move to adopt Ordinance No. 1270 levying regular property taxes for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2023 on all property both real and personal in the City of Snoqualmie which is subject to taxation for the purpose of paying sufficient revenue to carry on the departments of the City for the ensuing year; and providing for severability and an effective date.
