SUMMARY

INTRODUCTION

The City of Snoqualmie requires a regular levy in the amount of \$8,625,781 which includes an 0.83% increase in property tax revenue in the amount of \$69,895 from the previous year in order to discharge the expected expenses and obligations of the City of Snoqualmie.

ANALYSIS

BUDGET IMPACTS

The property tax is a significant source of revenue for the General Fund (#001) and has been incorporated, including the percentage increase and dollar amount (\$69,895) available to the City of Snoqualmie, into the proposed 2023-2024 Biennial Budget. NEXT STEPS

The second reading of the ordinance is scheduled for November the 28th.

PROPOSED ACTION

Move to adopt Ordinance No. 1268 certifying an increase in the regular property tax revenue for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2023 on all property both real and personal in the City of Snoqualmie which is subject to taxation for the purpose of paying sufficient revenue to carry on the departments of the City for the ensuing year; and providing for severability and an effective date.
