

Proclamation

WHEREAS, more than 1,600 people in the United States suffer from cardiac arrest each day; and

WHEREAS, over 70% of all cardiac arrests happen outside of a hospital and in homes; and

WHEREAS, less than 46% of the people who experience out of hospital cardiac arrest receive the immediate help they need before professional responders arrive; and

WHEREAS, part of the EMS System includes training members of the community to respond to cardiac arrest events and to provide care before EMS providers arrive; and

WHEREAS, early access to CPR and automated external defibrillators, or AEDs, has been proven to dramatically improve cardiac arrest survival in the out of hospital setting; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Katherine Ross, Mayor of the City of Snoqualmie, Washington, do hereby proclaim June 1 through 7, 2023, as

NATIONAL CPR & AED AWARENESS WEEK

in the City of Snoqualmie, reminding the community of the importance of CPR & AED Training, and to encourage the community to learn CPR and the use of an AED.
