SUMMARY

SUMMARY STATEMENT

This agenda bill recognizes National CPR & AED Awareness Week 2023 and is designed to spotlight how lives can be saved if more Americans know CPR and how to use an AED. It also places importance on the willingness of bystanders to act in a cardiac arrest emergency.

BACKGROUND

National CPR & AED Awareness Week was first initiated in 2007 following a partnership between the American Red Cross, the American Heart Association, and the National safety Council to highlight the importance of learning CPR and AED techniques to save lives.

Seventy percent (70%) of all cardiac arrests occur in the home and only 46% receive immediate help from a CPR trained layperson. Learning CPR and AEDs can save lives and improve out of hospital cardiac arrest survival.
