BACKGROUND:

This report provides a summary of Fire Department activity and performance for the fourth quarter of Fiscal Year 2025/2026.

DISCUSSION / ANALYSIS:

During the reporting period of April 1, 2026, through June 30, 2026, the City of Sonora Fire Department responded to 471 calls for service. These calls included emergency medical responses, fire incidents, public service calls, and automatic or mutual aid responses. The department continued to meet service demands while maintaining training, inspection, and interagency cooperation efforts to support public safety and disaster preparedness within the community.
