The Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) addresses the City of Sonora's planned response to extraordinary emergency situations associated with natural, technological, and human caused emergencies or disasters within or affecting the city.

#### EMERGENCY PLAN REVIEW CROSSWALK 2022 LOCAL GOVERNMENT AGENCIES

#### Introduction

The Cationia Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cd OES) maintains the State Emergency Plan (SEP), and the coordination at local emergency plans with the SEP in accordance with:

- Government Code § 8568 making the State Envergency Plan effective in each of the state's political subdivisions and requiring each governing body to carry out the provisions of that plan.
- GC § 8567 giving the Governor the responsibility to "coordinate the preparation of plans and programs for the milligation of the effects of an emergency by the political subdivisions of this state, such plans and programs to be integrated into and coordinated with the State Emergency Plan."
- GC § 8570 (d) permitting the Governor to "provide for the approval of local emergency plans".
- GC § 8584 permitting the Governor to "... assign part or all of his powers and duties under this chapter to the Office of Emergency Services".
- GC § 8573.32 requires countries to send a copy of its emergency plan to Cal OES on or before March 1, 2022, and upon any update to the plan after that date.
- GC § 8407 (e) to be eligible for any funding of response-related costs under disaster assistance programs, each local agency shall use the standardized emergency management system.

A local government's Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) establishes an emergency management organization to provide a basis for the juridiction's coordinated actions before, during and after a disaster. The primary purpose of the EOP is to outline the juridiction's alt-haraxis approach to emergency operations to protect the safety, health, and welfare of its afters. The juridiction's EOP and Continuity Plan (continuity of operations and continuity of government) complement each other. This crosswalk is designed for reviewing local government EOP's and hol continuity plans. Nore information on continuity planning con be found on the CoLOES Continuity Planning website.

# **City of Sonora Disaster Council**

# Sonora Municipal Code 8.30 -Emergency Services

### Revision of the Sonora Municipal Code 8.30 - Emergency Services

Counties and cities may create disaster councils by ordinance (CA G.C. §8610). In the ordinance or by resolution adopted pursuant to the ordinance, the governing body of a county or city may provide for the emergency organization, powers and duties, divisions, services, and staff of the organization.

The Emergency Ordinance provides the legal basis of the emergency organization and must address the following:

- The ordinance must provide for a Disaster Council
- A chairperson or director of the Disaster Council must be specified
- The emergency organization must be recognized
- Compliance with the Emergency Services Act must be stated
