RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE NORTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO LOWER SPEED LIMIT ALONG A PORTION OF NC HIGHWAY 12

Whereas Safety on NC 12 is always a concern of the Town of Southern Shores,

Whereas the Town of Southern Shores has an interest in the safety and well-being of both pedestrians and vehicle drivers and passengers utilizing NC State Highway 12; and

Whereas The population in the Town of Southern Shores is increasing year-round and NC 12
traffic at or over capacity even during non-vacation season: and

21 Whereas There have been numerous documented crashes related to pedestrians and bicyclists; and

Whereas Lowering the speed limit to 35 MPH on NC 12 within the Town Limits is important tothe safety of pedestrians and bicyclists as well as vehicles: and

Whereas the North Carolina Department of Transportation controls and administers traffic
regulations and speed limits through established policies and best engineering practices along
North Carolina State Highway 12 in the Town of Southern Shores, NC; and

30 **Whereas** the speed of vehicles travelling NC State Highway 12, especially during low-light times 31 of the mornings, late afternoons, and evenings, is a concern for the safety of large numbers of 32 pedestrians seeking to cross the highway travelling to and from the beach; and

Whereas a majority of the 18 crosswalks on NC State Highway 12 in Southern Shores are not signalized" and are located in "mid-block" areas between the state highway's intersection width,

Now, Therefore, the Southern Shores Town Council does hereby resolve that the North Carolina Department of Transportation is requested and urged to lower the speed limit along NC State Highway 12 throughout the Town limits to 35 mph, install signage and/or lighting focusing on pedestrian safety, allow for longer pedestrian crossing times, repaint faded crosswalks and treat the NC 12 corridor as a major pedestrian and vehicular corridor with special, and additional steps that could be taken to enhance pedestrian safety and still keep vehicular traffic moving in a safe, though slightly slower mode.
