RESOLUTION NO. 2026-32

A RESOLUTION APPROVING SUMMARY PUBLICATION OF ORDINANCE NO. 509, AN ORDINANCE REPEALING, REPLACING, AND AMENDING CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 11 OF THE SPRING LAKE PARK CITY CODE RELATING TO BUSINESS REGULATIONS AND LICENSING

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Spring Lake Park has adopted Ordinance No. 509, entitled “An Ordinance Repealing, Replacing, and Amending Certain Provisions of Chapter 11 of the Spring Lake Park Municipal Code Relating to Business Regulations and Licensing”; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes, section 412.191, subdivision 4, authorizes the City Council, by a four-fifths vote of its members, to direct publication of only the title and a summary of a lengthy ordinance when the summary clearly informs the public of the ordinance’s intent and effect; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed the summary of Ordinance No. 509 set forth below and determines that it clearly informs the public of the intent and effect of the ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Spring Lake Park, Minnesota that the following summary of Ordinance No. 509 is approved for publication:

“On August 3, 2026, the Spring Lake Park City Council adopted Ordinance No. 509, which comprehensively updates, reorganizes, and clarifies Chapter 11 of the Spring Lake Park Municipal Code governing business regulations and licensing. The ordinance amends requirements applicable to peddlers, solicitors, transient merchants, garage sales, and Christmas tree sales; repeals and reorganizes the City’s alcoholic-beverage regulations into separately numbered code sections; updates tobacco and licensed-product regulations, including licensing, compliance checks, prohibited sales, enforcement, and penalties; expands and revises regulations governing pawnbrokers and secondhand-goods dealers, including transaction reporting and recordkeeping requirements; and updates licensing and operating standards for sexually oriented businesses and other regulated commercial activities. The ordinance also revises definitions, exemptions, application procedures, license qualifications, fees, background investigations, operational requirements, enforcement procedures, administrative penalties, statutory references, and related provisions throughout Chapter 11.
