City of Star Tree Grant Program

The City of Star Tree Grant Program will fund projects to purchase trees to be planted within the City of Star city limits. The program aims to make a positive change in the tree canopy, accommodate additional species that are well-adapted to our climate and engage residents in recognizing that trees are assets and provide significant benefits.

The funding is made available through the City of Star.

- Awards will range from \$100 to \$5000 and require a 50% match. A total of \$30,000 is available.
- Only one City of Star Tree grant may be awarded to an applicant per year.
- Applications are due by 5:00 pm on May 19, 2023.
- All applicants will be notified June 2, 2023 regarding funding. Projects can begin upon notification of funding and must be completed by August 2, 2023.

WHO MAY APPLY

- Residents, business owners, and Homeowners Associations (HOA) who are located within the City of Star city limits are invited to apply.

ELIGIBLE PROJECTS

An eligible project includes the purchase of tree/s 2" in diameter or 8-10' tall within the City of Star. Tree varieties must be included in the Treasure Valley Tree Selection Guide (See https://www.cityofboise.org/media/4078/tvtreeselectionguide 09 2018.pdf for more information). Other tree species are not eligible for this project. Trees must be planted in an area that can be seen by the public such as a planter strip along the sidewalk, neighborhood open space area, front yard of residence, or front-facing side of business.

FUNDING AND GRANT DETAILS

The maximum grant request for each project is \$5,000. Granted funds are only to be used for the purchase of trees. Grant awards are not meant to cover the applicant's total project budget, only to supplement the cost of a project by covering the cost of purchasing trees. We require a 50% grant match, so the monetary value of your matching contributions must be equal to — or greater than — your request from us. Matching contributions may include the purchase and installation of irrigation systems, time spent planning and preparing for the planting project, and/or volunteer or staff time spent planting the trees. The monetary value of volunteer time may be calculated at \$26.11 per hour (as calculated each year by Independent Sector), or you may substitute more accurate figures if they are obtainable.

The City of Star will purchase the requested trees from local nurseries. Applicants will be notified when trees are available. Applicants of successful grant applications agree to submit a photo of the completed project by August 3, 2023. Successful grant applications will be made public on the City of Star website.

GRANT APPLICATION EVALUATION CRITERIA

A panel consisting of City of Star employees will evaluate the applications and rank them based on the following criteria:

- Project benefits other residents in Star in addition to the applicant;
- Project has a high likelihood of completion;
- Budget is realistic and includes necessary match;
- Project is consistent with the goals of the grant.

TO APPLY

Applications must be submitted by email and must include:

- Completed Application
- Photo/s of your proposed planning site and surrounding landscape features.
- Map of the proposed planting site with proposed trees.

HOW TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION

Electronic submission (REQUIRED):

- 1. Attach the completed grant application form (pdf) to your e-mail.
- 2. Include your name/business/HOA name in the subject along with "Tree Grant Application." (Example: Rockbridge HOA Tree Grant Application)
