8	WHEREAS, the governing authority of the City is authorized by O.C.G.A. § 36-35-3 to
9	adopt ordinances and resolutions relating to its property, affairs, and local government; and
10	WHEREAS, Mayor and Council for the City of Stonecrest is the governing authority of
11	the City; and
12	WHEREAS, Mayor and City Council are authorized by the City Charter, as amended by
13	Senate Bill 21, adopted April 1, 2021, to adopt ordinances and resolutions for the administration
14	of the City and to create and appoint members to Committees, commissions, and committees
15	concerning the affairs of the City; and
16	WHEREAS, the City Charter grants the City the power to exercise and enjoy all other
17	powers, functions and rights necessary or desirable to promote the general welfare of the City and
18	its inhabitants; and
19	WHEREAS, the city council shall have the power by ordinance or resolution to establish
20	oversight, policy, and standing committees of the council; and
21	WHEREAS, the governing authority of the City has determined that it is in the best interest
22	of the City and its citizens to establish a standing committee known as the TIPS Committee of the
23	City of Stonecrest, Georgia; and

WHEREAS, it is the governing authority's desire that the TIPS Standing Committee

provide a forum for discussing best practices and to advise the City Council regarding best

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26	practices with respect to strategies for Transportation, Infrastructure, Parks and SPLOST action	
27	planning for Stonecrest and community.	
28	NOW THEREFORE, BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR	
29	AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STONECREST, GEORGIA, as follows:	
30	SECTION I	
31 32	ESTABLISHMENT OF THE TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE PARKS AND SPLOST (TIPS) STANDING COMMITTEE AND AUTHORIZATION	
33	In response to the City of Stonecrest's overall values and changing needs of the City's	
34	population, Mayor and Council hereby create a TIPS Standing Committee to advise and engage	
35	with City Council for such duration as Mayor and Council may desire (hereinafter referred to as	
36	the "TIPS Committee"). Creating this Committee is an opportunity for the City to affect	
37	substantive improvements to the City's review of comprehensive readiness to move project	
38	forward and to transform our City into one defined by the collective pursuit of a high quality of	
39	life for all residents.	
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41	SECTION II	
12	MISSION AND DUTIES	
43	The mission of the TIPS Committee is to receive public comments from the citizens of the	
14	City of Stonecrest as a part of the deliberation of the comprehensive actions to address the	
45	immediate need of improving legislative actions of City Council. The purpose of the TIPS standing	
46	Committee is to ensure:	
1 7	1. To provide as necessary and appropriate advice, reviews, reports and	
18	recommendations to the City Manager, Mayor, Mayor Pro Tempore and	
19	City Council on comprehensive activity and areas of immediate concern.	

50	2.	That lists of projects are equitable, appropriately prioritized, and well distributed
51		throughout the City.
52	3.	That each district of the City is represented and has the opportunity to advocate for
53		improved facilities and resources.
54		SECTION III
55		MEMBERSHIP
56	The T	TPS Committee shall be composed of five (5) members, two (2) of which shall be
57	Councilmem	pers appointed by the City Council. The City Council shall establish qualifications
58	for members	of the TIPS Committee. Each Committee person shall be nominated and approved
59	by the City Council. The Chair and vice chair shall be councilmembers appointed by the mayor	
60	and approved	d by council. Members must attend two thirds (2/3) of the TIPS Committee
61	meetings in a	calendar year.
62	Failure to do	so warrants removal from the Committee.
63		SECTION IV
64		TERMS
65	Each	member shall serve for a term of one (1) year. Members filling vacancies shall
66	serve the rem	nainder of the term to which they were appointed. A consecutive appointment is
67	permissible.	Members whose terms expire shall continue to serve until a replacement is
68	appointed or	a consecutive appointment is made. Any member may be removed with or without
69	cause by the	City Council.

70	<u>SECTION V</u>
71	COMPENSATION
72	TIPS Committee members will serve without compensation. Reasonable expenses for travel
73	and Committee related expenses may be reimbursed pursuant to a policy to be established by
74	the City Manager and approved by the City Council.
75	SECTION VI
76	QUORUM
77	A majority of the actual number of TIPS Committee members establishes a quorum.
78	Any action taken requires a majority of affirmative votes of the quorum present.
79	SECTION VII
80	GOVERNANCE
31	The TIPS Committee may adopt bylaws for the governance of the Committee. The TIPS
32	Committee shall set its own meeting schedule and establish the meeting agendas. Meetings shall
33	be governed in accordance with the Open Meetings Act found within the Official Code of
34	Georgia Annotated. The TIPS Committee shall meet at least eight days before each regularly
35	scheduled work session of the city council, having one meeting in each one meeting in each
36	month of a calendar year.
37	All meetings shall be open to the public and all records maintained by the TIPS
38	Committee shall be public records unless expressly exempted by a provision of the Georgia
39	Open Records Act. The TIPS Committee shall keep minutes of its proceedings, showing the
90	vote of each member upon each question, and shall maintain records of its examinations and
91	other official actions, all of which shall be filed in the office of the City Clerk. Copies of the

92	minutes shall be sent to the Mayor and each member of the City Council. At each meeting, the	
93	public shall be granted time for public comment.	
94	The chairperson shall serve for one (1) year or until re-appointed or a successor is	
95	appointed. The vice chair shall serve for one (1) year or until re-appointed or a successor is	
96	appointed. The Committee shall select one of its members to be the secretary if one is not	
97	appointed by staff.

109	ENFORCEMENT AND SEVERABILITY	
110	(a) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that all	
111	sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Resolution are or were, upon their	
112	enactment, believed by the Mayor and Council to be fully valid, enforceable and constitutional.	
113	(b) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that, to the	
114	greatest extent allowed by law, each and every section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase	
115	of this	
116	Resolution is severable from every other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this	
117	Resolution. It is hereby further declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that, to
