Council Member Crowe's husband and the funeral home's staff were 26 involved in an exchange, and everybody guns were drawn. The Police Department was contacted, and 27 a report was filed due to concerns about safety and perceived racial targeting. Another neighbor 28 requested the hearses to be moved. I said no. 29 30 Citizen Comment 3: Joan Monroe - Assistant City Manager is not doing the pledge of allegiance to, 31 two forensic audits, long-term facility use, rules of decorum are ludicrous. 32 33 Citizen Comment 4: Dave Thomas - Thanked police department during Mardi Gras and thanked 34 Events Coordinator. 35 36 Citizen Comment 5: B. Patterson - Cannot hear anything on Zoom; Four council members voted on 37 2023 budget and no information was provided regarding how to spend city funds; no one knows how 38 much money the city has. 39 40 Citizen Comment 6: Cheryl Dudley - Mentioned the resolution of city council. Residents, citizens, and 41 council need more time to speak. Mayors have more time to speak across the state 42
