Re: **Tow Fee Study**

Upon request of Chief of Police a tow fee comparison was done on cities with college campuses. Additionally other larger cities were contacted to review their tow fees. Agencies contacted include Bryan, Nacogdoches, College Station, Denton, Fort Worth, Dallas, Arlington, Wichita Falls, San Angelo, Waco, San Marcos and Lubbock and Lufkin.

After reviewing the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation website I found a tow fee schedule listing maximum amounts for tow based upon weight, length and daily storage rates. Below is a brief overview from the website. I also contacted Mr. Todd Forester 936-520-0947 who offered his services should the city/department need assistance in building out a policy.

Towing Fees

A VSF (vehicle storage facility) is allowed to collect fees for the towing of a vehicle, but only the fees that are directly related to the tow.

Facilities may charge **up to** the following statewide maximum fees, unless a lower fee is set by a municipality or county:

Definitions:

Light Duty Tow Weight – 10,000 lbs. or less.

Medium Duty Tow Weight – 10,001 lbs. to 24,999 lbs.

Heavy Duty Tow Weight – 25,000 lbs. and over.

Incident Management Tow – From a traffic accident or incident that adversely affects normal traffic operations.

Private Property Tow - A tow of a vehicle authorized by the owner of a parking facility.

Drop Fee – a fee incurred once a vehicle is fully hooked up.

Licenses may start employing the new fees listed above on November 1, 2021.

Below are the cities I reached out to, their ordinances and tow fee rates as I could find them online or by telephone. Some cities work solely with one wrecker service, others regulate all the tow services. Furthermore, it is worth noting that the fees set by the TDLR are for private property towing ONLY. The city is responsible for setting caps to tow companies related to rotation call tows.

Bryan

Sec. 126-162. - Maximum fees to be charged for nonconsent tows.

The maximum fees charged by tow companies performing nonconsent tows shall be set by resolution and shall reflect fair value of towing services. Itemized receipts shall be provided to owners or operators at the time payment of tow related fees are made. Violations of this provision may result in suspension of permit, and criminal penalties against the offender. Towing fees may be reviewed by the city council once annually upon request of a tow company. A towing fee study shall be performed in conjunction with this review.

Upon contacting the Bryan Police Department I spoke with Misty Contreras the Intake supervisor, she told me they currently operating on a 2014 tow fee schedule but that they are looking at raising their rates. The current rates are set at:

- \$150 for light duty
- \$225 for medium duty
- \$350 for heavy duty
- \$125 private property tow
- Drop fee \$50
- Use of winch \$35 extra if officers signs off on ticket. This charge is in relating to nonconsent tows.

College Station

After talking to College station I was told they contract with two tow services; Excel towing and BDS towing and recovery. The department was unable to provide me with the rates so I contacted Excel towing and BDS towing and was unable to get a fee schedule. An open records request can be made to see the purposed rates, but one was not completed due to time constraints.

City of Nacogdoches

Sec. 102-382. - Maximum fees to be charged for non-consent tows.

The maximum fees charged by tow companies for non-consent tows are hereby established by the city as set forth below and reflect fair value of towing services. Itemized receipts shall be provided to owners or operators at the time payment of tow related fees are made. Violations of this provision may result in suspension or removal from the tow rotation list, and criminal penalties against the offender. Towing fees may be reviewed by the City of Nacogdoches bi-annually. A towing fee study shall be performed in conjunction with this review.

(Fees listed below are for non-consent tows) (Fees listed below do not include any charges other than tow, to include the use of dollies, go-jacks and clean-up of debris when called for) *Fuel surcharge*. Due

to the ever increasing prices of fuel a surcharge will be allowed for each cent past the price of \$3.50 per gallon of fuel. Once it is determined that the price of fuel has surpassed the price of \$3.50, the police department will, on a monthly basis, advise what amount can be added to a towing invoice in the amount of \$0.30 for each cent over the amount of \$3.50 as a surcharge. The police department will base the price of fuel on the lowest price of two local distributors at the beginning of each month once it is determined that the price is above \$3.50 per gallon.

City of Denton

Sec. 23-154. - Towing fee schedule; payment.

(a)The towing fee schedule is established by city council and maintained on file in the office of the city secretary.(b)No towing fees may be charged other than those fees listed in this article, including charges for dollies, special equipment, or mileage.(c)Weight, for purposes of this article, shall be determined by the gross weight recorded on the vehicle registration.(d)If the owner or operator of a vehicle which is parked in violation of this Code or state law arrives before the vehicle is hooked up, the tow truck operator shall release the vehicle for free.(e)A towing company may charge a fully prepared for transport fee when a vehicle has been fully prepared for transport but has not been removed from the property.(f)A towing company may charge the standard non-consent fee when it removes a vehicle from

the property.(g)For payment of any fee under this article, a towing company or vehicle storage facility shall accept payment by cash, electronic check, debit card, and credit card for any charge associated with delivery or storage of a vehicle. However, payment by credit or debit card may be refused if the named cardholder is not present.(h)Release of a vehicle may not be denied based on the inability of the towing company or vehicle storage facility to accept payment by electronic check, debit card, and credit card of any charge associated with delivery or storage of a vehicle, unless the inability to accept such payment is due to factors outside the control of the towing company or vehicle storage facility, such as a power outage or machine malfunction. In such case, payment due shall be frozen until a twelve-hour period of time has elapsed.(i)In no way is this section to be construed to mean that a towing company or vehicle storage facility may not charge less than the fees stated in the towing fee schedule. The fees in the towing fee schedule are the maximum that can be charged for any towing or drop fee of a vehicle in accordance with this article.(j)A towing company or vehicle storage facility must provide a copy of the City of Denton Towing Customer Bill of Rights with each receipt for any non-consent tow performed within the city limits of Denton. This obligation may be satisfied by conspicuously posting a copy of the City of Denton Towing Customer Bill of Rights at the towing company or vehicle storage facility pay window.

ARTICLE VI.

VEHICLE TOW SERVICE FEES.

SEC. 48A-43. MAXIMUM FEE SCHEDULE.

(a) The maximum fee that a licensee or permittee may charge for vehicle tow service, regardless of whether a tilt-bed wrecker or a conventional wrecker is used, is:

(1) \$121 for towage of a vehicle with a manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating of not more than 10,000 pounds;

(2) \$191 for towage of a vehicle with a manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating of more than 10,000 pounds but not more than 26,000 pounds; and

(3) \$445 for towage of a vehicle with a manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating of more than 26,000 pounds.

(b) No additional fee may be charged for linkage of a vehicle prior to a tow or for the use of dollies or go-jacks.

(c) If a licensee or permittee tows a stolen vehicle, or a vehicle later determined to be stolen, the licensee or permittee may charge the lawful owner of the vehicle no more than the maximum fee for towage. A vehicle tow service may not charge a fee to the police department if the police department takes custody of a stolen vehicle.

(d) A licensee or permittee commits an offense if he, either personally or through an employee, subcontractor, or agent, charges:

(1) more than the maximum fee allowed by this section for the particular vehicle towed; or

(2) any fee in addition to:

(A) a towage fee lawfully charged under this section; or

(B) a storage, preservation, or notification fee lawfully charged under the Vehicle Storage Facility Act.

(e) A licensee or permittee shall provide a vehicle owner the option of paying the fee for vehicle tow service by cash or a major credit card. (Ord. Nos. 19099; 19300; 21435; 23106; 24175; 25812; 27721)

In summary Dallas sets fees at:

- \$121 for light
- \$191 for medium
- \$445 for heavy

I did not find anything in their ordinance in relation to private property towing

Arlington

Arlington appears to be following the state standards set by the occupations code which are then defined in the TDLR of maximum fees of \$272 for light duty, \$380 for medium duty and \$489 - \$978 for heavy duty.

Section 4.24 State Regulation and Towing Charges

A. The owner or operator of a wrecker business commits an offense if he charges a fee in excess of the maximum fee for the applicable nonconsent tow set by State regulation in accordance with Chapter 2308 of the Texas Occupations Code, as amended.

B. A wrecker service operator or vehicle storage facility operator may not charge any other fee except as authorized by law.

Galveston

ARTICLE XII. - FEES AND CHARGES

Sec. 37-221. - Permissible fees and charges.

Permissible fees and charges:

(1)The following are the maximum fees that any permittee shall charge for a tow in the city, subject to the exceptions set forth in subsection (2) below:

Incident management tows\$165.00

Trailer w/o vehicle165.00

Trailer and vehicle200.00

Over the seawall250.00

Lift vehicle off guard rail or obstacle75.00

Ditch or sand winch out75.00

Rollover85.00

In the water vehicle250.00

Heavy duty tow500.00

Motorcycles175.00

(2)The following are exceptions to the above standard fees: a.If a heavy duty vehicle tow service is called and the pick-up requires the unloading of a combination vehicle or multiple heavy duty wreckers to clear a scene, the permittee or wrecker operator shall immediately notify the officer on the scene that the pick-up is exceptional. The on-scene officer shall ask dispatch to notify the compliance officer, his or her designee or patrol sergeant to approve the exceptional tow status. Upon approval, the officer shall note "exceptional" on the operator's towing form. b.If a heavy-duty wrecker is needed to tow an abandoned vehicle, the on scene officer shall call the compliance officer or his or her designee to the

scene. If the compliance officer, or designee, determines that a heavy-duty wrecker is required, the officer on the scene, compliance officer or designee shall call for the next-out heavy duty. c. Exceptional heavy duty tow rates: 1. Two hundred dollars (\$200.00) per hour (with a one-hour minimum) to prepare the vehicle, the trailers and load for safe towing; and 2. A maximum of twelve and one-half cents (12.5¢) per pound of the actual weight of the load and vehicle, including any trailers. The weight will be determined by certified weight scale receipts for such loaded vehicles and trailers. d. Towing companies shall not charge a storage fee that exceeds the maximum allowable under state law. e. In the event the vehicle owner or operator desires to have the vehicle towed to a destination outside the city boundaries, the wrecker company, agent, representative or operator may negotiate a price with the vehicle owner or operator to tow to the destination. f. The maximum rates provided under this chapter shall be displayed on any invoice provided to the person picking up a vehicle.

Galveston does not appear have private property tow rates listed either. Their rates are \$165 for an incident management tow and \$500 for heavy duty. Galveston has several other charges related to wrecker usage that could be applicable to our city.

Wichita Falls

Sec. 26-767. - Towing fees.

(a) A city permit holder performing consent tows may collect fees that are deemed reasonable in accordance with the provisions set forth in Chapter 2308 of the Texas Occupations Code.

(b) City permit holders performing non-consent tows shall not charge fees that exceed the maximum amounts described in the following subsections.

(c) Rotation list towing fees:

(1) Light duty towing (towing a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight of 10,000 pounds or less):

a. A fee of \$120.00 per hour shall be paid to a towing company for towing a vehicle from one point to another location within the city as directed by the police department. This fee includes any work performed during the first hour. Time posted after the first hour will be billed in increments of 15 minutes.

b. Second tow truck: In the event the police officer at the scene determines that a second tow truck is required, a fee of \$120.00 per hour shall be paid to the towing company for any work performed at the scene during the first hour after the arrival of the second tow truck. Time posted for the second tow truck after the first hour will be billed in

increments of 15 minutes. The use of the second tow truck shall be approved by a police supervisor. Travel time is excluded.

c. Use of a dolly: No additional fees shall be charged for the use of a dolly.

(2) Medium duty towing (towing a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight over 10,000 pounds but less than 25,000 pounds):

a. A fee of \$150.00 per hour shall be paid to the towing company for towing a vehicle requiring a medium duty tow from one point to another location within the city as directed by the police department. This fee includes any work performed during the first hour. Time posted after the first hour will be billed in increments of 15 minutes.

b. Second tow truck: In the event the police officer at the scene determines that a second medium duty tow truck is required, a fee of \$150.00 per hour shall be paid to the towing company for any work performed at the scene during the first hour after the arrival of the second medium duty tow truck. Time posted for the second tow truck after the first hour will be billed in increments of fifteen (15) minutes. The use of the second tow truck shall be approved by a police supervisor. Travel time is excluded.

c. Use of a dolly: No additional fees shall be charged for the use of a dolly.

(3) Heavy duty towing (towing a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight of over 25,000 pounds):

a. A fee of \$300.00 per hour shall be paid to the towing company for towing a vehicle requiring a heavy duty tow from one point to another location within the city as directed by the police department. This fee includes any work performed during the first hour. Time posted after the first hour will be billed in increments of 15 minutes.

b. Second tow truck: In the event the police officer at the scene determines that a second heavy duty tow truck is required, a fee of \$300.00 per hour shall be paid to the towing company for any work performed at the scene during the first hour after the arrival of the second heavy duty tow truck. Time posted for the second tow truck after the first hour will be billed in increments of 15 minutes. The use of the second tow truck shall be approved by a police supervisor. Travel time is excluded.

c. Extra equipment: If the towing company is required to rent or lease a piece of equipment which is not required in the

normal operation of a towing company, the actual cost for lease or rental of such equipment may be passed on to the vehicle owner.

d. A minimum of two towing company employees must respond and share the responsibilities with each heavy duty tow truck to expedite the clearing of the roadway and increase safety. Failure to respond with two towing company employees will be counted as a failure to respond and the tow truck will not be allowed to work the scene.

(4) Public Safety Towing Administration Fee. For vehicles towed at the instruction of a Police Officer, the rotation list towing fee is hereby increased by \$25.00.

(d) Hourly rates for private property non-consent tows include any work performed during the first hour beginning upon arrival at the scene of the tow. Time posted after the first hour will be billed in increments of 15 minutes. The hourly private property tow rates are as follows:

(1) Light duty: not more than \$90.00.

(2) Medium duty: not more than \$120.00.

(3) Heavy duty: not more than \$205.00.

(e) When establishing or amending the allowable fees for non-consent tows, the amounts shall represent the fair value of the services of a towing company and are reasonably related to any financial or accounting information provided to the city. In accordance with Texas Occupations Code § 2308.203, the city establishes the following procedures relating to towing fee studies to be followed upon a request from a towing company that a study be performed.

Wichita falls policy is extensive and detailed.

For incident management tows they allow for:

\$120 for light

\$150 for medium

\$300 for heavy duty tows

They have private property rates of:

\$90 for light duty tow

\$120 medium duty

\$205 for heavy duty tow.

(a) *Category A wreckers:*

Service Description	Max. fee
1. Police-authorized tow from accident scene - a flat fee of \$150.00 unless a police officer determines that any of the following services are needed:	\$150.00
a. Waiting time - each additional ½ hour after the first ½ hour - \$50.00.	
b. Winching fee - \$50.00 per ½ hour.	
c. Additional labor for clean-up - \$50.00 per ½ hour.	
d. Dollies - \$50.00.	
2. Police-authorized tow - Impound/non-accident (all inclusive) [double hookup, dollies, winching, flatbed, waiting time, cleanup etc.]	\$150.00

Lubbock

I contacted Sgt. Barrera, she stated that for abandoned vehicles they charge \$90 for regular weight and \$250 for heavy weight vehicles. They also do a \$10 administrative fee and \$20 per day after. Storage fee is \$20 a day for light duty vehicles and \$35 a day for heavy weight. Additionally, she said that the wreckers charge \$30 for regular weight and \$250 for heavy weight.

Lufkin

§ 4.08.014

Fees for towing and storage.

(a) Towing fees.

(1) Standard fees shall be set by the chief of police regarding routine small rotation pulls. Large rotation pulls shall not exceed the usual and customary charges for like services provided in the tow truck industry within the city.

(2) A tow truck operator may make a request for an "extraordinary tow" charge prior to assessing fees in excess of usual and customary charges for like services provided in the tow truck industry within the city. An "extraordinary tow" is the removal of a vehicle that, in the opinion of an on-scene LPD officer, involves procedures, methods, or equipment not typically utilized during an ordinary removal (e.g., hookup to a vehicle that is substantially above or below ground, the use of additional tow trucks, cranes, ramps, jacks, or torches, or removal of spilled cargo). A tow truck operator seeking such authorization must present to the LPD officer on-scene a "rotation tow truck fees" book noting the reasons the tow should be treated as an extraordinary removal. The "rotation tow truck fees" book shall be printed by the police department and made available to towing companies through the department's traffic safety section.

(3) Fees for small rotation "extraordinary tow" shall be as set forth in the fee schedule.

(b) Storage charges. Storage charges shall not exceed usual and customary charges for like services provided within the city commencing with the time the vehicle is placed inside the storage area. All storage charges shall cease at the time the owner or his representative requests the vehicle from the storage yard of the tow truck company, provided the request is made during regular business hours. No charge for storage shall be assessed if the vehicle is removed or requested from the tow truck company within two (2) hours of the time it is placed into storage.

(c) Posting of fees. Each tow truck company listed on the rotation list shall post a schedule of maximum fees for each tow and storage.

I contacted the Lufkin Police Department and found they contract with tow companies on a rotation list and have a set standard of \$50 a tow.

In Conclusion

After reviewing the 13 agencies I could get information from I created an Excel worksheet breaking down the information I gathered. Attached below will be that sheet but in synopsis the average tow fee in relation to rotation tows is:

- \$124 for light duty tow
- \$152 for medium duty tow

The average drop fee to be:

My recommendation to the city would be:

- Set a minimum number of wreckers each company must have.
 - 1 light duty wrecker
 - 1 medium duty wrecker
- Rotation call out from arrest/vehicle accident fee of:
 - \$160 for light duty
 - \$180 for medium duty
 - \$400 for heavy duty
- Private property tow fee of:
 - \$100 for light
 - \$150 for medium
 - \$200 for heavy
- Drop fee of:
 - \$100 for light
 - \$150 for medium
 - \$200 for heavy
