WHEREAS, the St. Tammany Parish Government owns and operates the Castine Regional Sewage Treatment Plant; and

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (LPDES) permit which authorizes effluent discharge from the Castine Regional Sewage Treatment Plant mandates the Parish to institute a program directed towards pollution prevention in order to improve operating efficiency and extend the useful life of the treatment facility; and

WHEREAS, as part of Other Conditions, Section H. of LPDES permit LA0120154, the Parish Government must complete an annual Environmental Audit Report for the life of the permit, and said Environmental Audit Report is attached hereto.

TAMMANY PARISH GOVERNMENT HEREBY RESOLVES that the St. Tammany Parish Council acknowledges the receipt of the 2025 Municipal Water Pollution Prevention Environmental Audit Report for the Castine Regional Sewage Treatment Plant and its finding that no actions are necessary at this time to maintain compliance.
